# ABOUT US

- KentuckyWired provides service to state government offices, public universities, community colleges, and other public customers
- Kentucky is the first state in the nation to build a statewide, open-access, fiber optic cable network to each of its counties
- Construction is 99% complete due to a small gap in Ring
  4. Overall project completion is 96% due to incomplete migrations in Ring 4
- The network currently transports traffic for 388 Executive Branch agencies and 39 KCTCS campuses
- Planning is underway to migrate 118 Administrative Office of Court sites
- When migrations are completed, the network will transport traffic for 764 locations



## 2024-2026 BIENNIAL BUDGET

- The project is Availability Payment (AP) funded
- Projected increase in baseline APs for FY25 & FY26
- Certain components of the APs increase with inflation
  - Historically, inflation has allowed costs to remain within nominal annual increases
  - The capital portion is escalated by set annual percentage; The noncapital portion of the AP is impacted by inflation
  - The non-capital portion is escalated by a combination of the material and labor Consumer Price Indexes (CPI)
- Potential increase in the Service Provider portion of the AP projected for FY26
  - Contractual Market Testing process every 10 years of 30-year contract

## 2024-2026 CAPITAL PLANS

#### KentuckyWired Critical Infrastructure Updates

- Contractual obligation to refresh equipment at 10-year intervals
- Equipment must be upgraded to maintain required performance
- Includes core equipment utilized to provide services in 120 counties
- \$12.9M This is the first phase of six-year plan

#### KentuckyWired Critical Infrastructure Purchases

- Original shelters required replacement due to structural failures
- New shelters were purchased & financed under an existing contract
- The capital plan allows the Commonwealth to purchase the shelters
- \$12.4M Total amount of the cost for this component
