




#### Premature Death in Kentucky







Percentage of adults who reported ever being told by a health professional that they had diabetes (excluding prediabetes and gestational diabetes)




The **2022 Kentucky Physician Report** produced by the UK Center of Excellence in Rural Health notes that:

- Almost half of Kentucky primary care physicians work in Fayette and Jefferson County.




# The number of children who have received all doses of recommended early childhood vaccines is below 75 percent in most states.




