

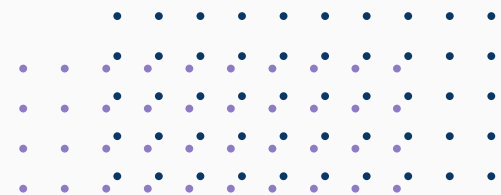

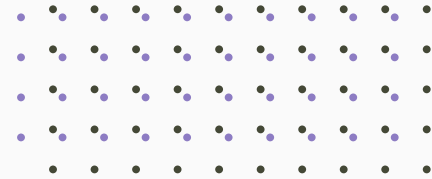

What is an IPA?

An Independent Provider Association (IPA) is a collaborative network of health care providers who work together to improve the quality of their care and promote efficiency and effectiveness in the delivery of health care that produces value.

CA-IPA Mission

The mission of the CA-IPA is to increase access and improve the quality of behavioral health services for Kentucky's at-risk children and families.

In 2018, the CA-IPA was formed to bring providers together to promote innovative, efficient, and effective behavioral health services through support and collaboration to increase access and quality of care for at-risk children and families across Kentucky.

Rewards health care providers with incentive payments for the quality of care provided.

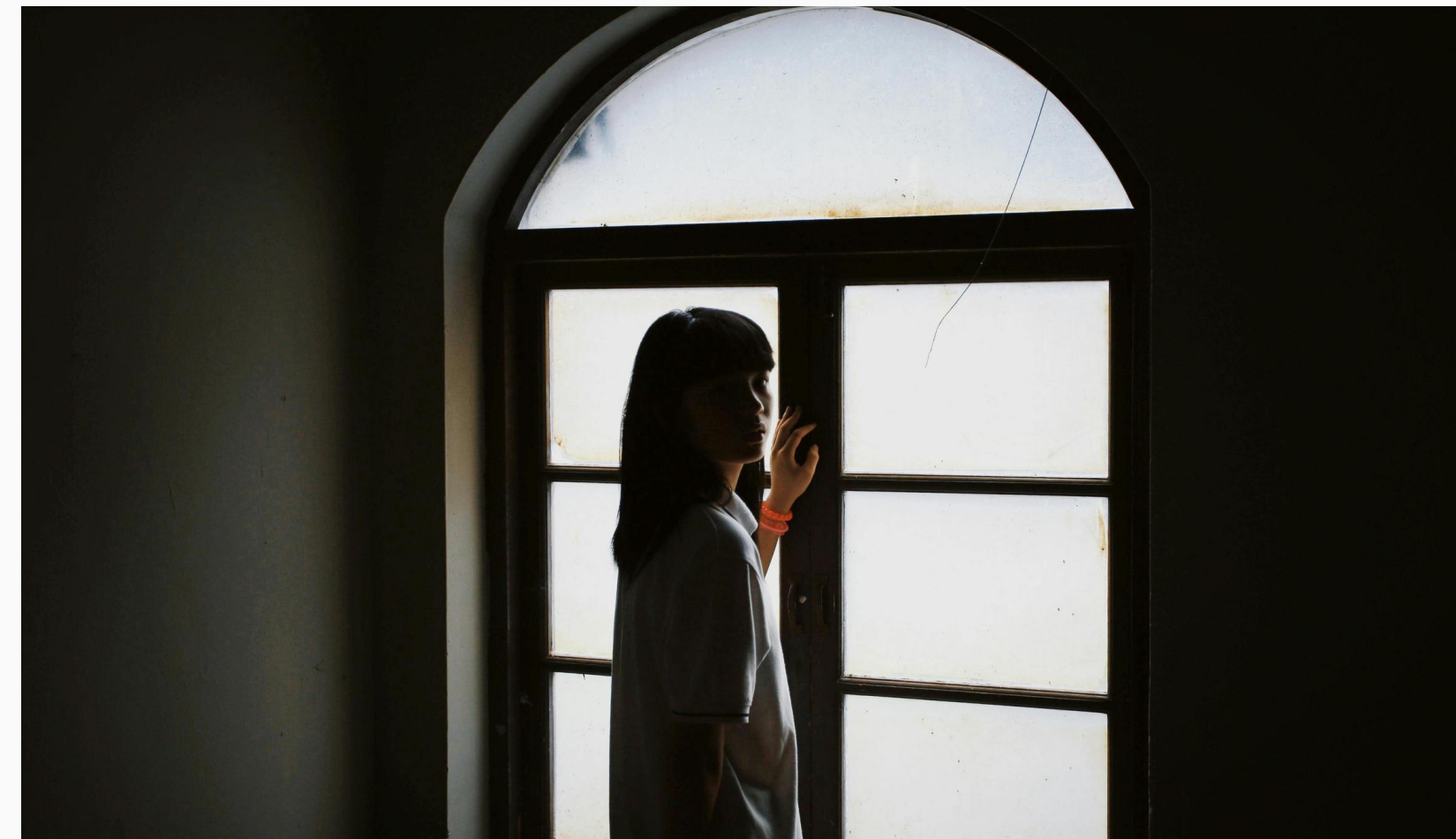
Focuses on the quality of the service that was provided.

Focuses on quality of care vs. quantity of care.

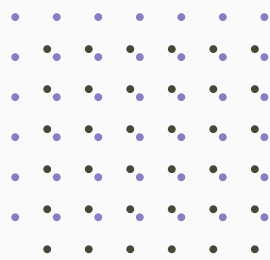
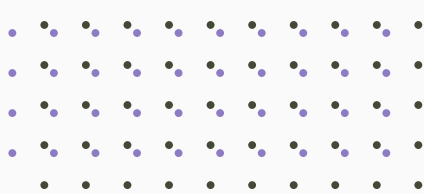

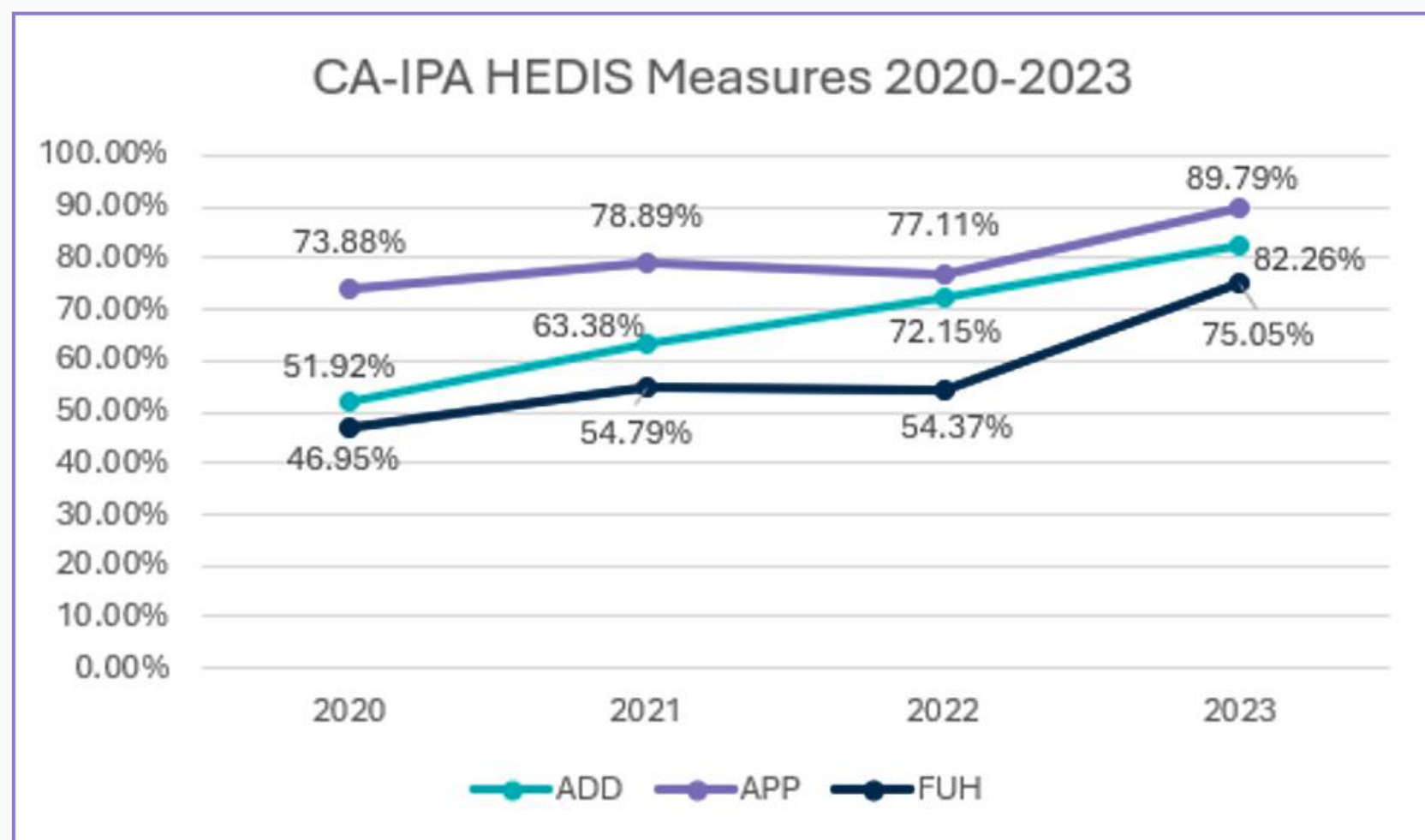


With physical locations spanning from Pikeville to Paducah, these organizations provide services to children and families throughout Kentucky.





HEDIS Measures 2020 – 2023

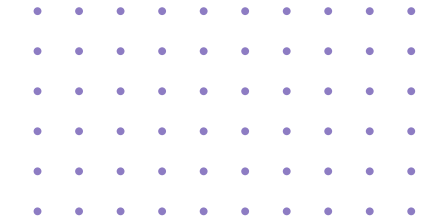


HEDIS stands for **Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set** developed by the **National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)**, it is a widely used tool in the United States that allows health plans and regulators to measure, report, and compare the quality of healthcare services.

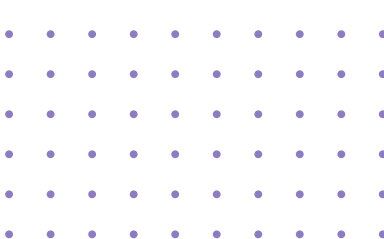
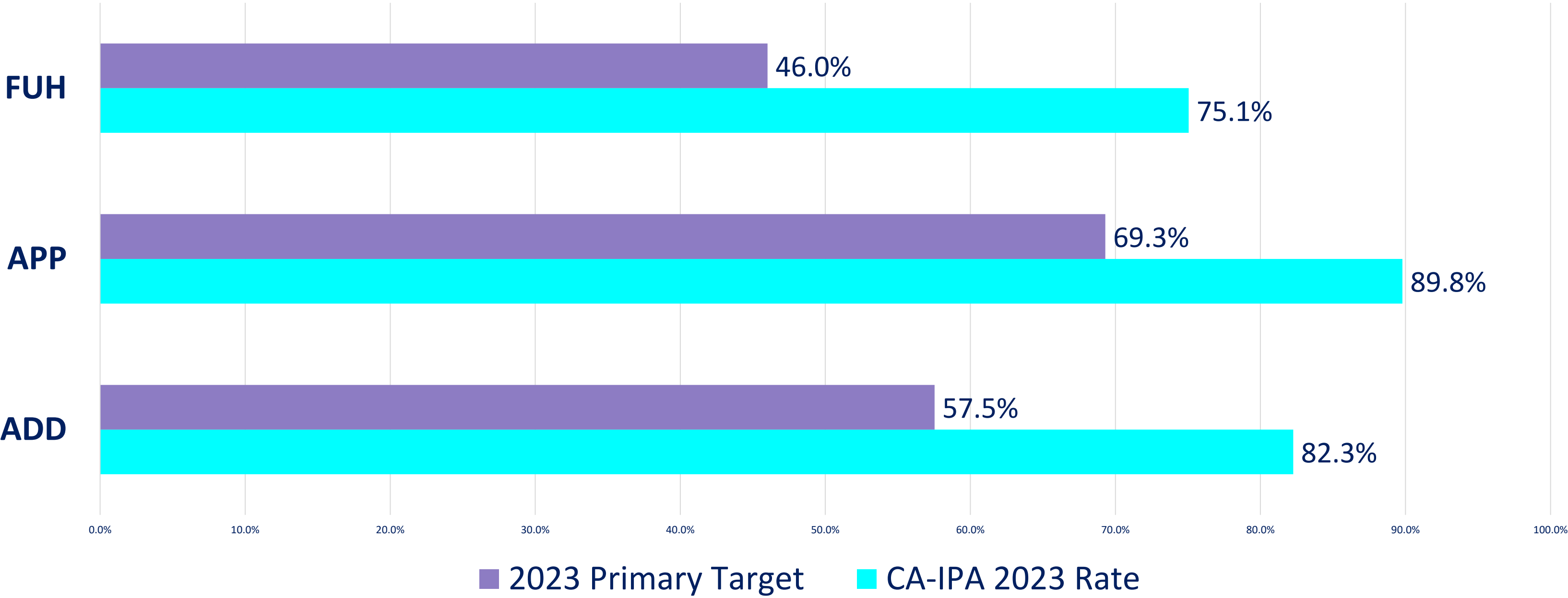
ADD (Follow-Up Care for Children Prescribed an ADHD Medication) – A member on ADHD medication who had at least three follow-up care visits within a 10-month period.

FUH (Follow up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness) – A member who went inpatient and had a follow-up within 7 days post discharge.

APP (Use of First-Line Psychosocial Care for Children and Adolescents on Antipsychotics) – A member prescribed a new antipsychotic medication and had psychosocial care at first-line treatment.

FUHMI (Follow-Up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness) – A member who went inpatient and had a follow-up within 7 days post discharge.

MMCAA (Metabolic Monitoring for Children & Adolescents on Antipsychotic Medication) – A member who had two or more antipsychotic medication dispensed within the year and had BOTH cholesterol and Glucose blood test.

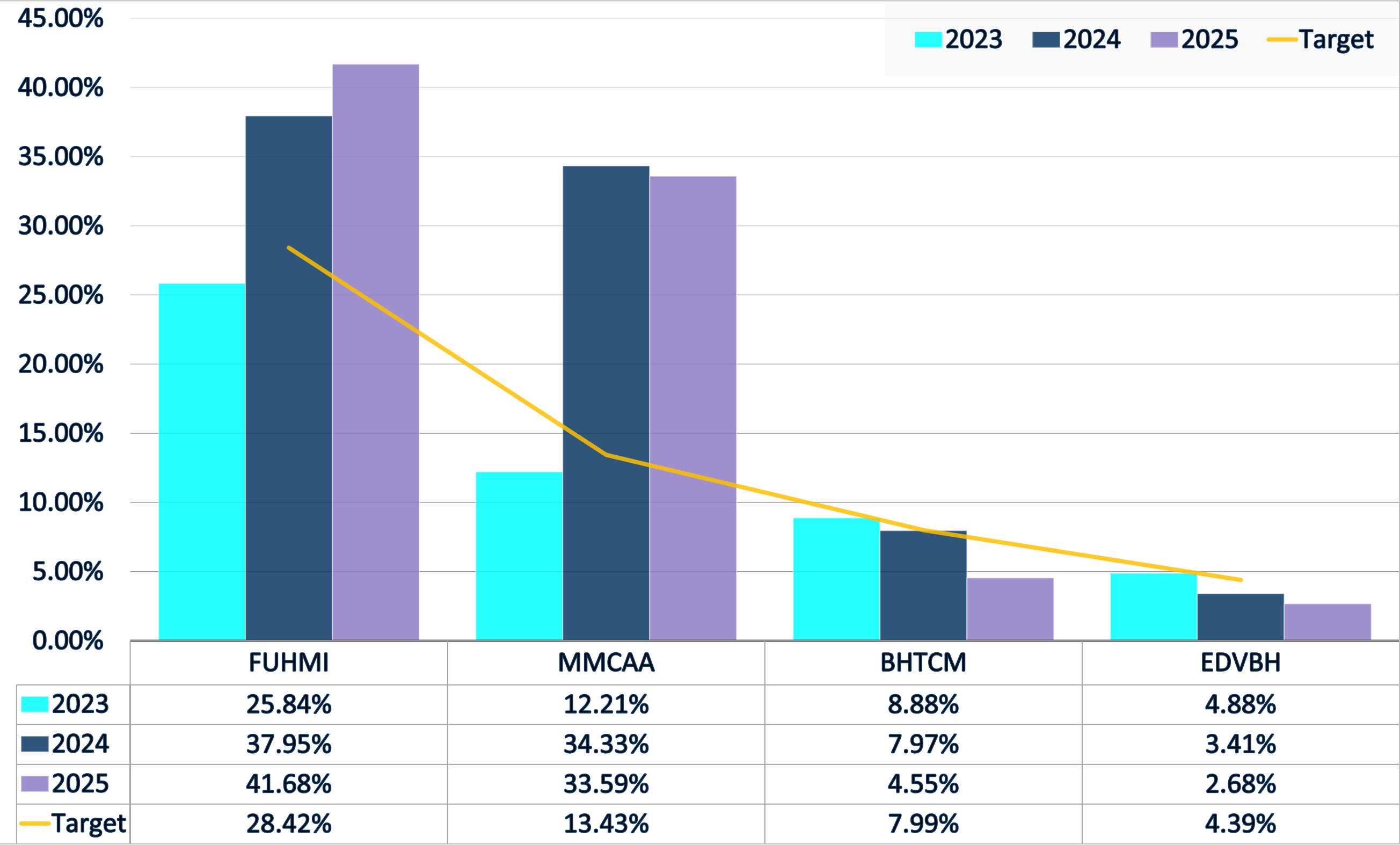
BHTCM (Utilization of Inpatient Behavioral Health Services while receiving Targeted Case Management) – A member who went inpatient WHILE receiving TCM.

EDVBH (Emergency Department Visit for Behavioral Health while Receiving Outpatient Services) – A member who went to the ED WHILE receiving outpatient services.

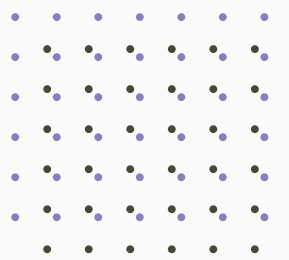
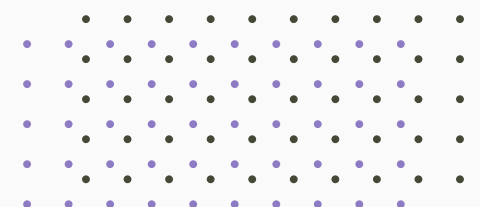




2024 – 2025 Rates

969 members kept out of the hospital



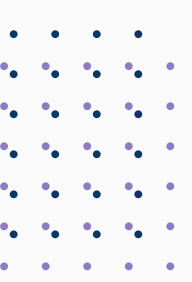
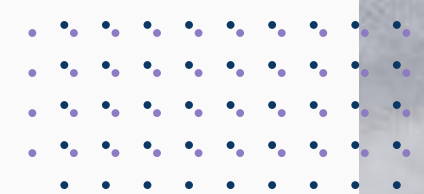
264 labs completed
