# **Kentucky HEALTH Recap**

### WHY: Unsustainable Growth



- High poverty and Medicaid enrollment
  - Workforce participation rate 59.4% (45<sup>th</sup> in the nation)
  - 19% of Kentuckians in poverty
  - 47<sup>th</sup> in the nation for median household income
  - Nearly 1/3 of state population enrolled in Medicaid
- Kentucky has poor health outcomes despite high spending
  - 1 in 3 Kentuckians have weight-related health issues
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> highest rate of smoking in the nation
  - 1<sup>st</sup> highest in the nation for cancer deaths
- No long-term financing plan
  - \$1.2 billion projected spending on expanded Medicaid over the next five years (SFY 2017-2021)

Every \$1 we spend on expanded Medicaid is \$1 we cannot spend on coverage for pregnant women, children, and individuals who need Medicaid due to age, blindness, or having a disability.

### Kentucky HEALTH



Kentucky will enroll non-disabled adult and children beneficiaries beginning July 2018.\*

**Kentucky HEALTH** is the new health and well-being program for certain low-income adults and their families.

### WHY: Skills-to-Jobs Gap

Middle-skill jobs account for 58 percent of Kentucky's labor market, but only 48 percent of the state's workers are trained to the middleskill level.

Beginning **April 1, 2018**, citizens who will qualify for Kentucky HEALTH and have a My Rewards Account are able to **view the My Rewards Account balance** on **Citizen Connect**.

In addition, citizens may **take courses** on Citizen Connect and get preventive health services to continue earning My Rewards dollars that go toward their My Rewards Account balance.

Some Kentucky HEALTH beneficiaries will be able to **use the dollars in their My Rewards Accounts** when Kentucky HEALTH goes live in **July 2018**.

From January 1<sup>st</sup> through May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2018, 72,068 individuals earned My Rewards dollars. The total amount of My Rewards dollars earned was \$5,721,375, with the maximum amount earned by a single member being \$400.

## Legal Challenge Update



- Oral Arguments 6/15 in Washington D.C.
  - Judge signaled ruling likely prior to 7/1/18
  - Adverse ruling could impact various components of the 1115, and/or the 1115 program as a whole
- Adverse ruling could have the following consequences:
  - Technology changes/costs
  - Communication changes (could cause significant confusion among recipients, providers, MCOs, etc.)
  - Immediate benefits cuts (dental, vision, likely pharmacy removed for low-income adult eligibility groups)
  - Expansion eligibility group at risk (immediate evaluation of rolling back expansion)
