- 1 to achieve the mission of the center.
- 2 (5) Nothing in this section shall be construed to restrict the study of rural health
 3 policies, workforce analyses, or the training of health professionals in or for rural or
 4 medically underserved areas by other state universities.
- 5 (6) The University of Kentucky shall report to the Council on Postsecondary Education
 6 and the Legislative Research Commission a detailed, audited statement of
 7 expenditures for each program function in the Center of Excellence for Rural
 8 Health Care by September 1 of each year which enumerates expenditures for the
 9 preceding fiscal year.
- Section 3. Whereas there is currently a shortage of healthcare workers in the
 Commonwealth, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its
 passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
