# **Proposed SB 90: Behavioral Health Conditional Dismissal Program Extension**

# SB 90: Brief Overview

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SB 90 provides an alternative to incarceration by allowing eligible defendants to receive treatment for substance use and/or behavioral health disorder.

The program's goal is to divert low level defendants charged with certain **non-violent, non-sexual misdemeanors** and **Class D felonies** away from jail and into treatment for substance-use disorder(s) and/or mental-health issues.

# SB 90: Brief Overview

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If the defendant is determined to be eligible for the Behavioral Health Conditional Dismissal Program (BHCDP), the prosecutor can enter into an agreement with the defendant to participate.

The program provides an array of services such as outpatient or inpatient treatment, cognitive and behavioral therapies, education, vocational services, and housing assistance provided by approved treatment providers and in partnership with Kentucky Adult Education.

BHCDP is funded as follows:

- Defendant's current health insurance (including Medicaid); or
- If uninsured, the Opioid Abatement Trust Fund - administered by the Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities (BHDID).

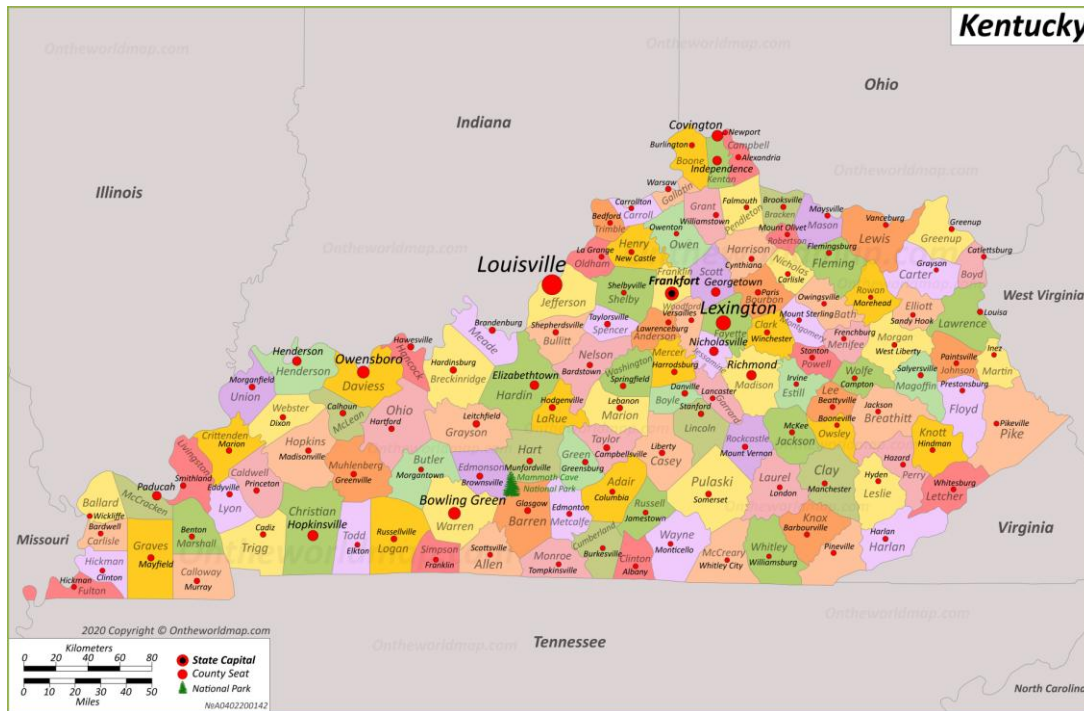
# Eligibility Criteria

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- Must be at least 18 years of age, Kentucky resident, and
  - Charged with a qualifying offense. (*Exclusions: violent offender, sex offense, DUI, domestic violence, or protective orders against victim*).
  - Who does not have a previous conviction for Class A, B, or C felony, or a Class D felony or misdemeanor that is not a qualifying offense; and
  - Assessed by Pretrial Services as low-risk for failure to appear, low-risk for new criminal activity.
  - Clinical assessment determines defendant has a substance use and or mental health disorder.
- or
- Attorney for the Commonwealth or defendant's attorney identifies them as a viable participant in the program.

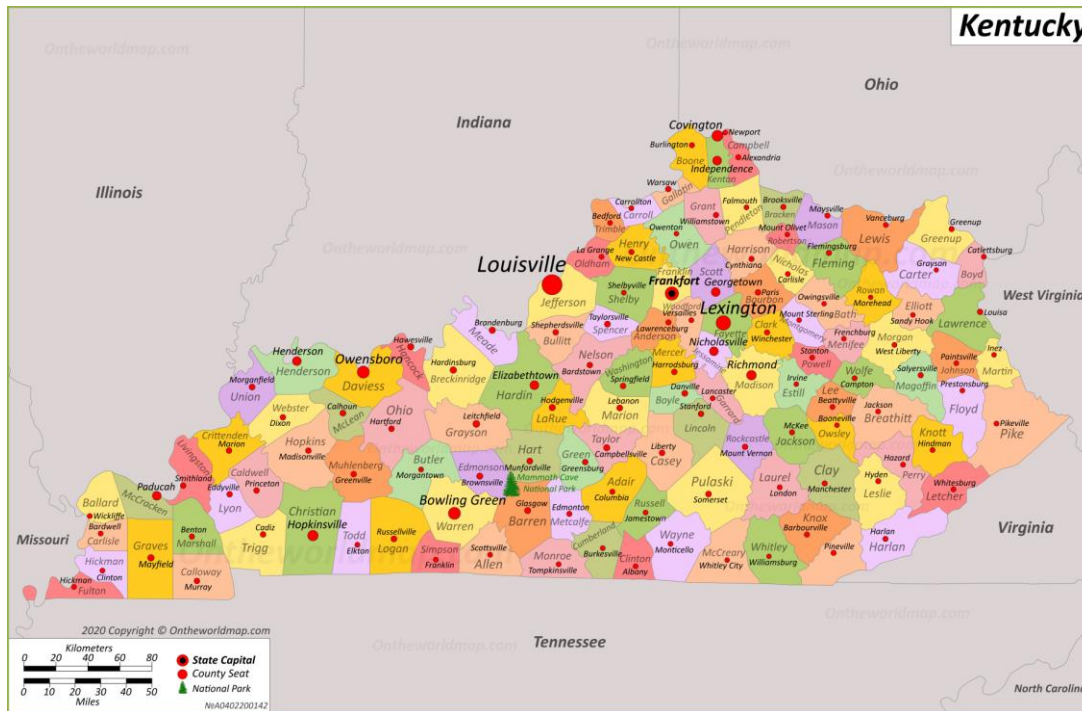

# Funding

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- Treatment services will be funded through the defendant's current health insurance (including Medicaid)
- Department of Medicaid Services and provider may assist eligible participants in obtaining Medicaid services
- If uninsured, providers may access the Behavioral Health Conditional Dismissal Program Trust Fund administered by BHDID.
- Trust funded by appropriations, grants, opioid settlement funds, philanthropic efforts, and any other contributions by public agencies or entities
- \$10,500,000 is appropriated each fiscal year from the Opioid Abatement Trust Fund
  - Under proposed SB 90 no new funding appropriation is necessary

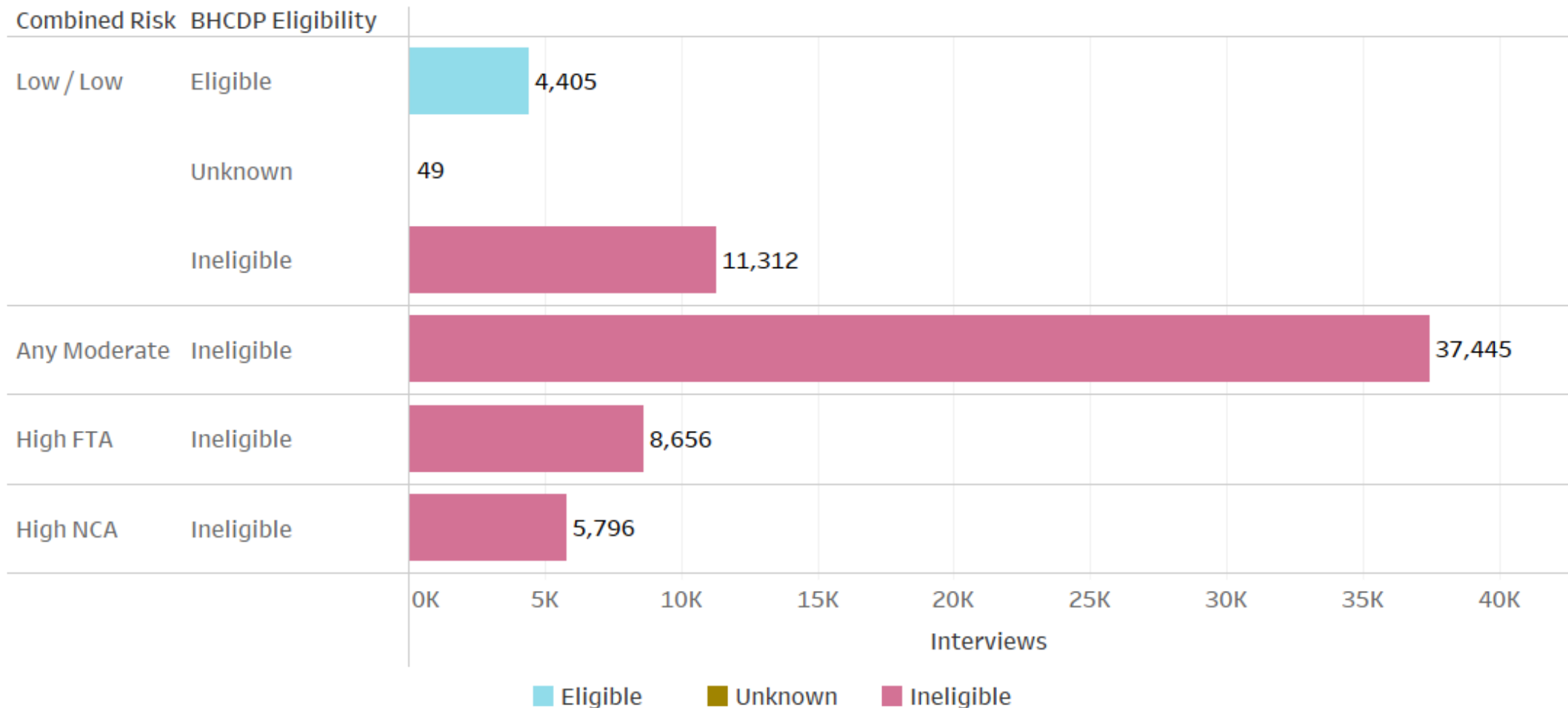

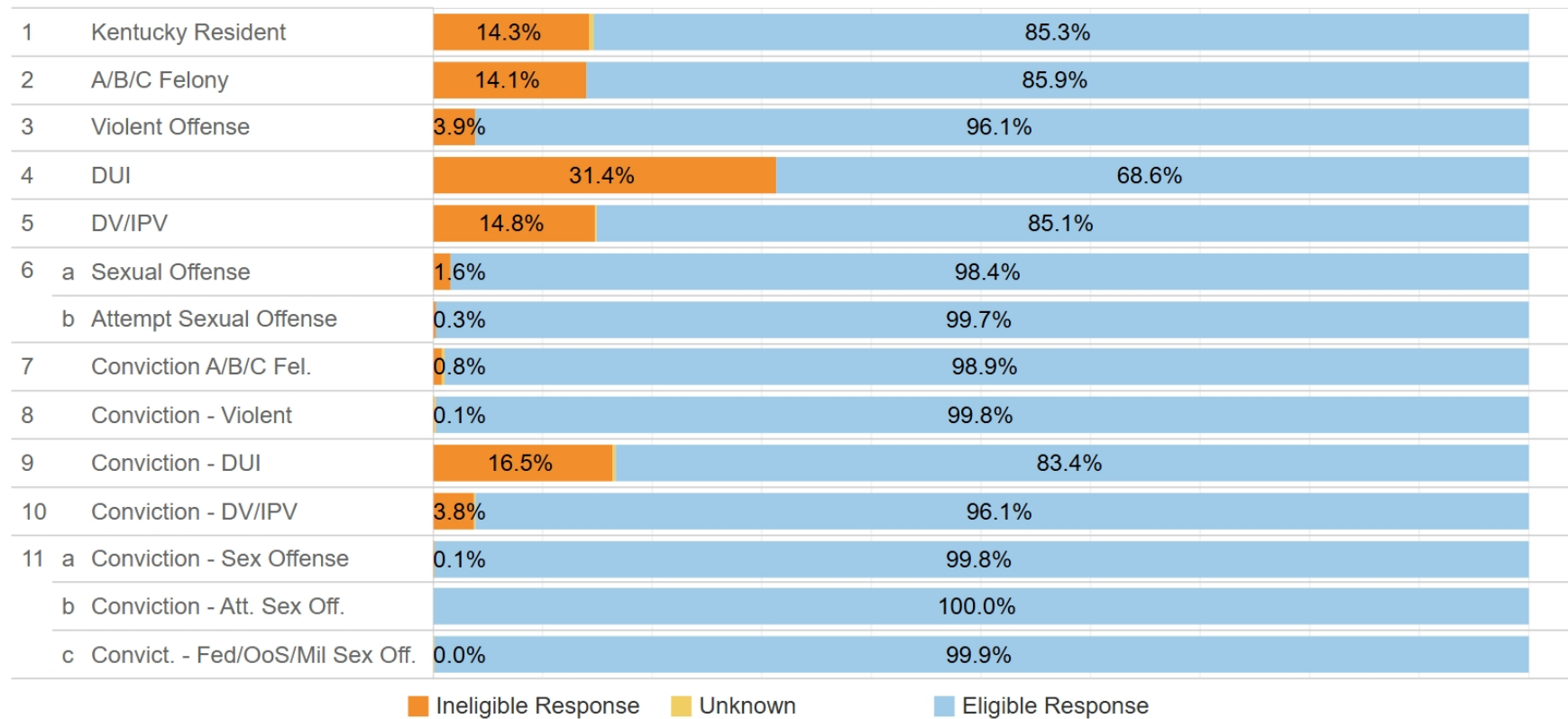
# Eligibility for Program

Interviews Receiving BHCDP Eligibility Assessment 1/1/2023 - 9/30/25



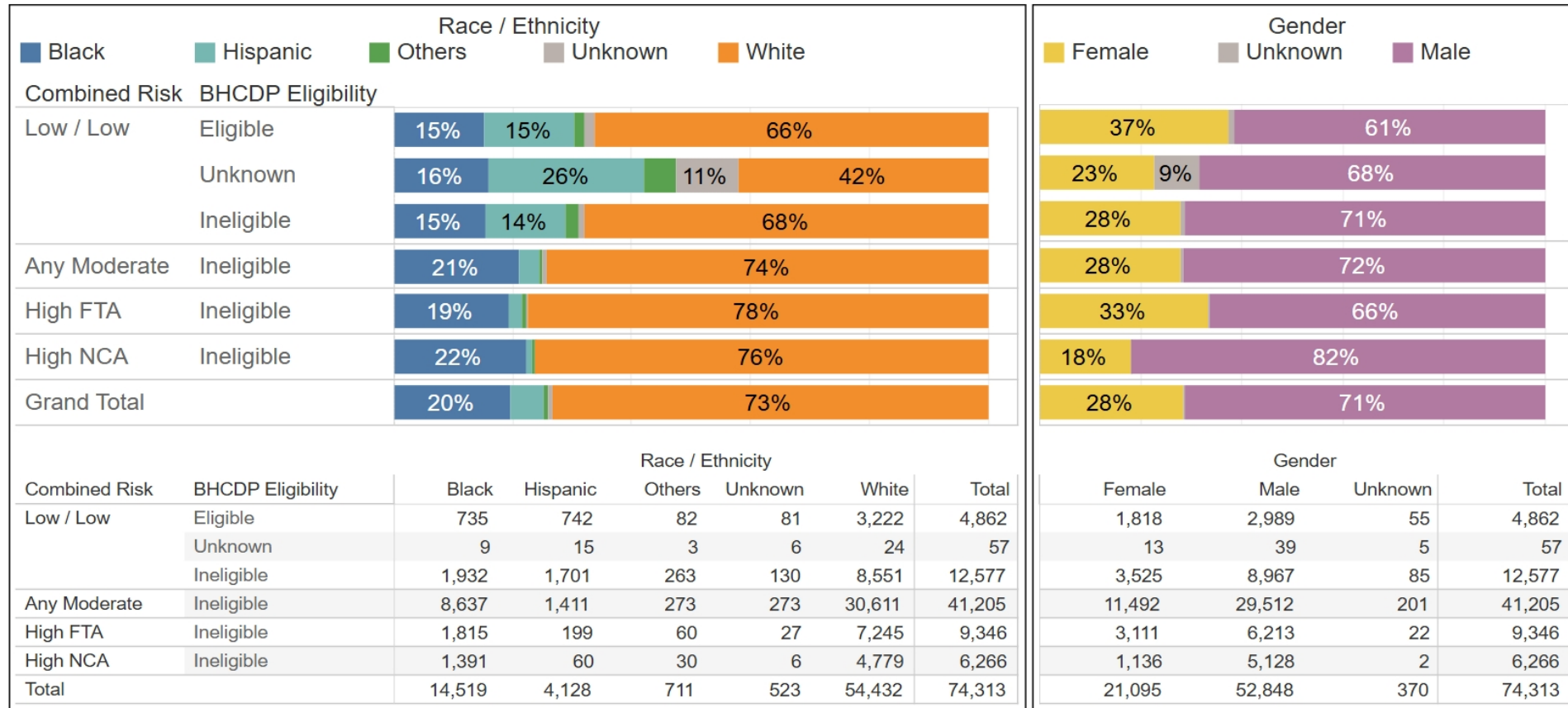
# Low/Low Eligible/Excluded

Interviews Assessed PSA Low/Low Receiving BHCDP Eligibility Assessment 1/1/2023 - 12/31/2025



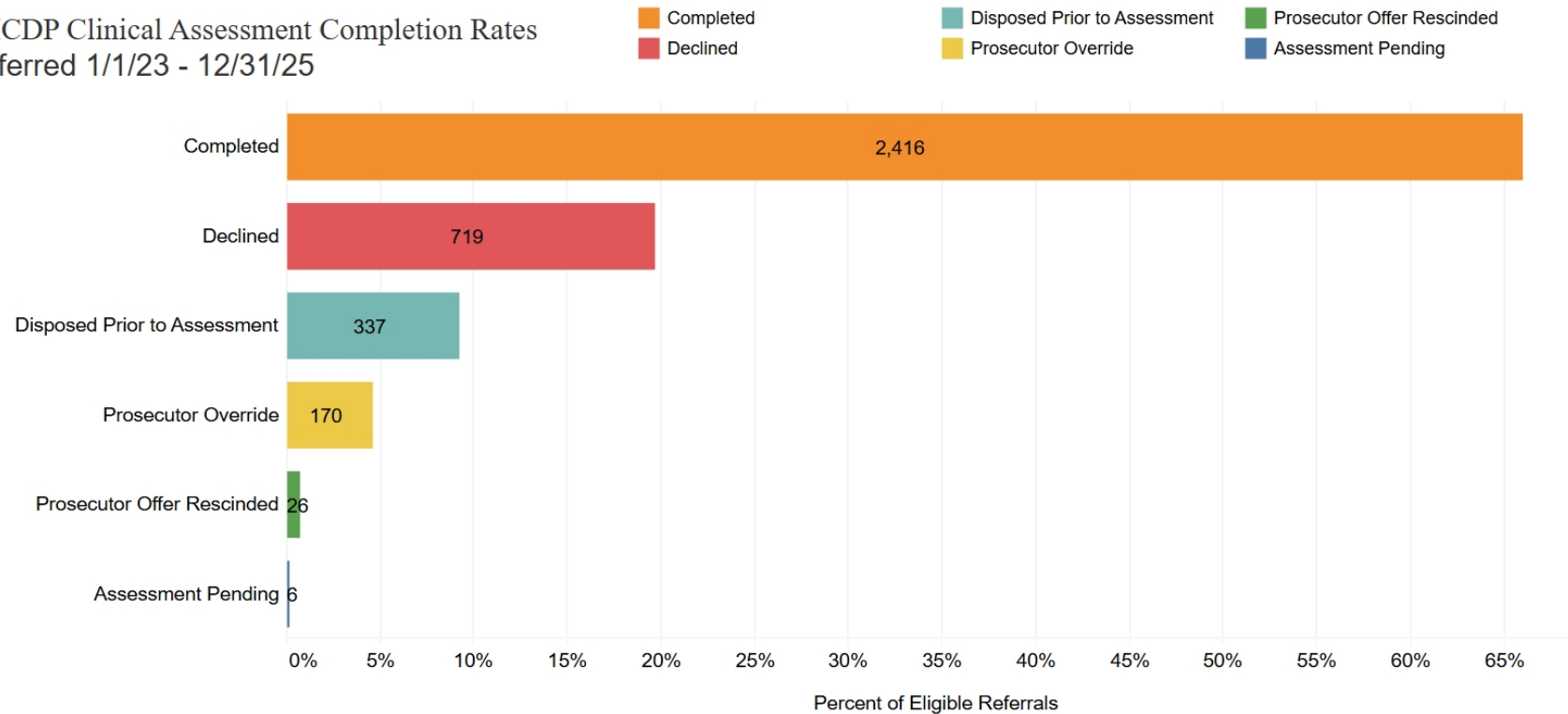
# Demographic Information

# Completion Rates of Clinical Assessments

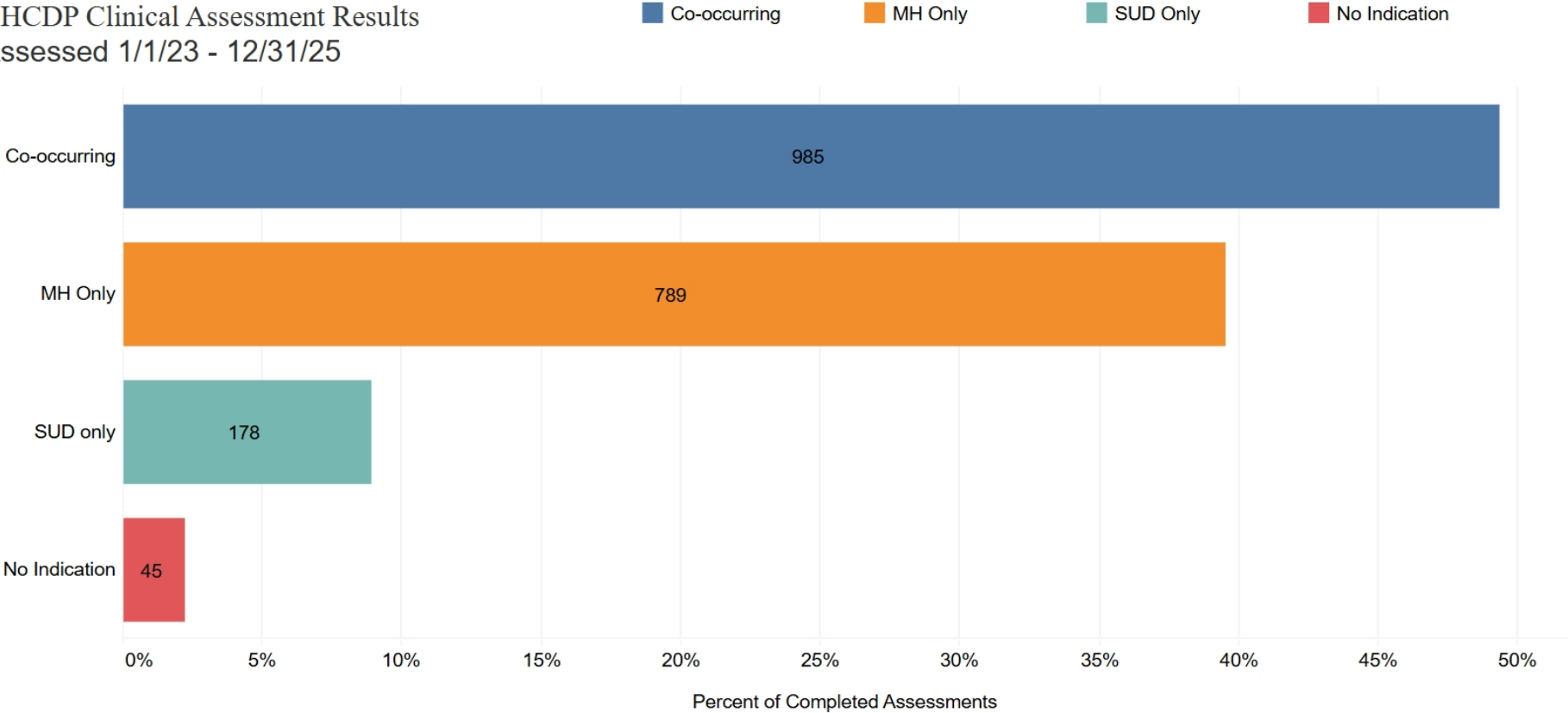
BHCDP Clinical Assessment Completion Rates
