

SAFE ACT of 2016

Requires the KSP Lab (if funding provided) to:

- Complete Sexual Assault Cases within an average of 90 days for cases submitted July 1, 2018
 - We are running behind by about 6 months
 - Renovations took longer than expected
 - Three of ten new analysts left us before training completed
 - Hiring two new Lab Techs for Biology
 - Will lose at least 2 additional seasoned analysts this year
 - More expected if pay disparity is not fixed
- Complete sexual assault cases within an average of 60 days for cases submitted by July 1, 2020
 - If we can keep the staff, yes!

SAFE ACT of 2016

Requires law enforcement to have a policy to:

- Submit kits to the lab within 30 days
 - Mixed compliance (Kit tracking has been filling up with data and will be analyzed this summer)
- Retain evidence either 10 or 50 years unless certain conditions met
 - Those "conditions" are getting translated in may different ways and some kits still getting destroyed
- Inform victim of DNA testing and if there is a hit in the DNA database
 - Anecdotally, we are seeing that this does not always occur but more common than in the past
