The SAFE Act Report - Highlights

- Previously untested or partially tested kit
 - DANY $3173 \rightarrow 2604 \rightarrow 1229 \rightarrow 398$
 - SAKI 1424 tested

- Hospital tracking with barcode
 - Not mandated
 - Only 67 hospitals using

The SAFE Act Report – Highlights

- Gaps in collecting data
 - No uniform form, such as JC-3
 - Difficulty to follow a report to final outcome between systems – law enforcement, lab, prosecution

The SAFE Act Report - Highlights

- Law enforcement training
 - 197 agencies compliant with newly required training
 - Research to follow effects of training

SANEs

- 7 hospitals are "SANE-ready"
- 278 active SANEs
- Still need more
- Funding from OAG to KASAP for training video

Public Policy Positions

- Updated this month
- Conducted survey, received 100 responses
- Broad, inclusive statements

Oppression

To end sexual harassment, abuse, and assault, we must address all forms of oppression and inequality.

Public Policy Positions

- State and federal level funding for prevention and response services are paramount to combat sexual harm.
- Promote Prevention Strategies to End Sexual Harm
- Address Survivor Needs

Public Policy Positions

- Improve System Responses (Criminal, Civil, Campus, Prisons, etc.)
- Promote Public Safety
- Require Professional Education
- Protect Non-Profit Needs
