


## Prevalence of Parental Incarceration in Kentucky

More than 115,000 kids (12.1%) in Kentucky have experienced parental incarceration at some point in their lives. (Source)

Kids whose parents have been incarcerated are anywhere from two to five times more likely to experience other adverse childhood experiences than kids whose parents have not been incarcerated.

## Instability and Financial Hardships

- Kids are more likely to change residences when their mother is incarcerated.
- Financial hardships increase when the primary income earner is incarcerated; can be exacerbated by fines and fees, restitution, and jail calls.
- result in job loss and challenges securing employment.





## The Impact on Kids Well-Being

- Separation can weaken the bond between parents and young kids.
- It can be traumatizing for kids to see their parent arrested or in court.
- Parental incarceration is stigmatized and can negatively impacts kids' mental health and educational outcomes.
