### **Bills for Consideration**

#### **SB 43/CS**

## AN ACT relating to operator's licenses.

**Sponsor:** Senator Donald Douglas

Senate Bill 43 was discussed by its sponsor, Senator Donald Douglas, who indicated there was a committee substitute on the measure. Senator Greg Elkins made a motion to adopt the committee substitute. Senator Brandon Storm seconded the motion, which passed by voice vote. After brief discussion, Senator Brandon Storm made a motion to pass Senate Bill 43 as amended by the committee substitute. Senator Greg Elkins seconded the motion, which passed on a 9-0-0 roll call vote.

#### **SB 57/CS**

# AN ACT relating to funding health care services from increased penalties for speeding violations.

**Sponsor:** Senator Stephen Meredith

Senate Bill 57 was discussed by its sponsor, Senator Stephen Meredith, who indicated there was a committee substitute on the measure. Appearing with Senator Meredith was Richard Bartlett, Trauma Program Director, Kentucky Hospital Association; Jason Smith, MD, Chief

Medical Officer, University of Louisville Health; and Zach Warriner, MD, Trauma Surgeon. University of Louisville Health, who all spoke in favor of the measure. After brief discussion, Senator Mike Wilson made a motion to pass Senate Bill 57 as amended by the committee substitute. Senator Donald Douglas seconded the motion, which passed on a 7-1-1- roll call vote.
