

### **Critical Shortage Areas**


- A critical shortage area is defined as a lack of certified teachers in particular subject areas and/or grade levels.
- Critical shortage areas are reported to the U.S. Department of Education annually by Local Workforce Development Area.
- Shortage areas are defined using the prior school year's hiring data.



- If an emergency certificate has been issued, the teacher is not considered out-of-field for reporting purposes.
