INSTITUTION: Kentucky Community and Technical College System

OVERVIEW

Enactment of the Kentucky Postsecondary Education Improvement Act of 1997 (also known as “House Bill 1” or the “Act”) created the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) as the commonwealth’s ninth public postsecondary institution. The Act united the 15 Kentucky TECH postsecondary technical colleges and the 13 University of Kentucky community colleges under a single governing board – the Kentucky Community and Technical College System Board of Regents.

In everything we do, the KCTCS mission is to improve the quality of life and employability of the citizens of the commonwealth by serving as the primary provider of college and workforce readiness, transfer education, workforce education, and training.

PROPERTY/FACILITIES

KCTCS delivers its programs and services in classrooms and laboratories at 16 colleges on more than 70 campuses across the state. The colleges also provide programming off-campus in leased facilities, secondary education facilities in the local community, and military bases. Rapidly developing distance learning technologies are now making it possible for KCTCS to move beyond these traditional instructional methods. Online education and other technology have greatly increased the number and variety of programs that can be offered by KCTCS colleges. All KCTCS colleges are currently offering such programs.

The KCTCS System (administrative) Office, located in Versailles, is being acquired through a lease-purchase agreement with the City of Versailles.

KCTCS has a current enrollment of approximately 106,000 students. Enrollment has more than doubled since its creation in 1998. KCTCS currently has 359 buildings across the Commonwealth. These buildings contain approximately 8.4 million gross square feet. The average age of these facilities is approximately 29 years old.

The preservation and renovation of existing facilities will be of paramount importance as KCTCS strives to keep up with the demand for its services over the planning horizon. The construction of additional facilities does little to help if existing facilities are allowed to deteriorate. The creation of new instructional space and the preservation of existing space must go hand-in-glove if KCTCS is to fulfill its mission. The plan attempts to address future capacity issues and the adequacy of existing space for intended use while seeking support for a greatly expanded maintenance and renovation program.

In determining the priority order of projects in the first biennium of the KCTCS Six-Year Plan, KCTCS' biggest focus is the need to preserve existing physical plant. Included in this plan are both renovation and new construction projects. The criteria used to select these projects for inclusion in the plan, and for determining in which biennium they are placed, are weighted in favor of projects having an economic development impact in their service area and projects intended to ensure personal safety and asset preservation.

The top two projects in KCTCS' Six-Year Plan are a College Safety and Security Pool and a College Deferred Maintenance Pool. If funded, each college would benefit from both of these pools for safety and security upgrades and for HVAC, electrical or roofing upgrades.

A large number of renovation projects are included in the first biennium of the 2020-2022 Plan.

In order to address today's workforce needs, KCTCS must renovate and reprogram existing facilities. This can be accomplished by adding targeted new instructional capacity on existing campuses and at new locations across the state.

- 1. KCTCS College Safety and Security Pool** **\$16,000,000**
This project will provide funding to upgrade safety and security projects at each Kentucky Community and Technical College. (C-PI)
CPAB Staff Notes
 - *NEW project – has not been listed in a previous capital plan.*
 - *KCTCS is the only public higher education institution without a dedicated police force. With KCTCS' huge footprint throughout the state, the institution must rely on technology to help keep the campuses safe with a limited number of personnel. This project will deploy technology in the form of cameras, door access hardware, lighting, notification systems, emergency blue light phones, and emergency app software.*
- 2. Capital Renewal and Deferred Maintenance Pool** **\$30,000,000**
The intent of this project is to provide KCTCS a source of funds with which to address the replacement of building systems, i.e. roofs, HVAC systems, and electrical systems that have reached or exceeded their expected useful lives. These projects are known as capital renewal. (C-PI)
CPAB Staff Notes
 - *The VFA report determined that the renewal needs for KCTCS total approximately \$725 million. The report further indicated that there are many major system renewals due because 60 percent of KCTCS buildings were built over 20 years ago, and as would be expected, many systems are at the end (or beyond the end) of their expected useful life.*
 - *This project is authorized in the current budget (\$10 million RF), however, it has not been undertaken due to a lack of funding.*
- 3. Renovate Occupational Technology Building Elizabethtown CTC** **\$24,800,000**
This request is to renovate the Occupational Technical Building at Elizabethtown Community and Technical College on the main campus. The building was originally constructed in 1966. The renovation will include upgrades to the electrical, mechanical, and plumbing systems as well as a new roof and restroom upgrades. The renovation will allow for the expansion of programs and new advanced manufacturing programs. (C-PI)
CPAB Staff Notes
 - *This project was included in KCTCS' last capital plan at a scope of \$14.9 million. The cost of the project has increased mostly due to a rise in the construction cost estimate from \$10,920,000 to \$19,200,000.*
- 4. Renovate Main Campus Buildings Southcentral** **\$5,000,000**
Southcentral Kentucky Community and Technical College is requesting funding for the renovation of buildings on its main campus in Bowling Green. The renovations will focus on better aligning space on the campus to more effectively serve students, faculty, and staff of the college. (C-PI)
CPAB Staff Notes
 - *The primary service area of Southcentral Kentucky Community and Technical College includes the counties of Allen, Barren, Logan, and Warren. The school has approximately 4,800 students.*
 - *This project will renovate approximately 46,000 square feet in three buildings: Building A, 19,000 square feet, constructed 1968; Building D, 13,000 square feet, constructed 1968; and Building J, 13,000 square feet, constructed 1982. All buildings are in fair condition but have received no major renovations since they were constructed.*

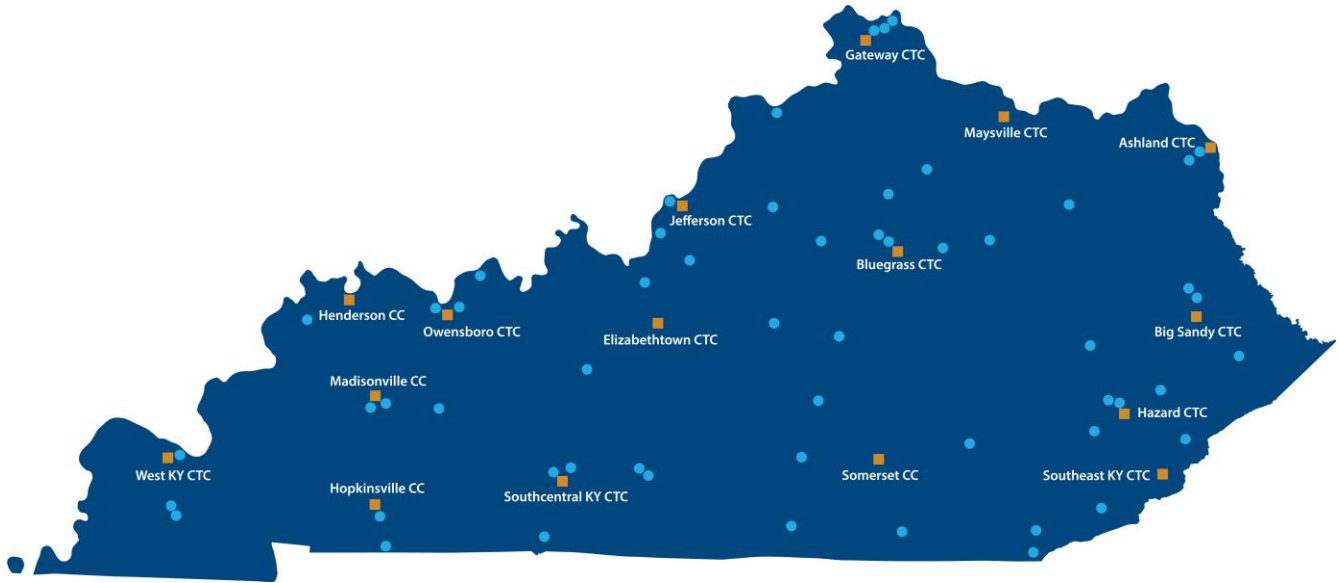
- 5. Renovate Hartford Building Jefferson Community and Technical College (CTC) \$31,100,000**
 This project will renovate the 104,000-gross-square-foot Hartford Tower at Jefferson CTC. This building has outdated technology in classrooms and labs, and aging and inefficient infrastructure. Based on a study to be performed, either a total renovation needs to be undertaken or a more cost-efficient new building needs to be constructed to replace the building. (C-PI)
CPAB Staff Notes
 – *The 2000-02 Executive Budget authorized an \$8 million bond-funded project to address the renovation needs of both the JF Building and the Hartford Tower. The project was completed in late 2003. This project is a Phase 2 request to continue the needed renovations not completed in Phase 1.*
 – *The primary purpose of the renovation will be for upgrades of all science labs in the Hartford Building, providing new equipment, casework, and furnishings, and making needed infrastructure upgrade.*
- 6. Renovate Pineville Campus Southeast Kentucky CTC \$3,000,000**
 This project will renovate the Pineville Campus at Southeast Kentucky Community and Technical College. Space needs to be repurposed due to nursing programs that were moved to the New Educational Alliance Center in Middlesboro. This has freed up space for new programming in Pineville in telemedicine, physical therapy assistant, occupational therapy, radiography, and substance abuse counseling certificate (C-PI)
CPAB Staff Notes
 – *This 22,000-square-foot facility was constructed in 1982 and is in excellent condition. There have been no recent capital projects completed on this building.*
 – *The campus currently serves over 125 full-time students in nursing, surgical technology, certified nursing assistant, medical laboratory technology, and respiratory care. With the opening of the new Educational Alliance Center in Middlesboro, the nursing program will be moved there freeing up space for new programming in Pineville in telemedicine, physical therapy assistant, occupational therapy assistant, radiography, and substance abuse counseling certificate. These new programs would add 70 new students to the campus.*
- 7. Renovate and/or Construct Administration Building Maysville CTC \$15,500,000**
 This project will renovate approximately 55,000 gross square feet in the Administration Building at Maysville CTC. This project will make structural repairs, as well as aid in energy savings and campus beautification. The structure has cracks in the walls and is in need of window replacement, brick replacement, weatherproofing, and insulation. Based on a study to be performed, either a total renovation needs to be undertaken of this building or if more cost efficient a new building needs to be constructed to replace the Administration Building. (C-PI)
- 8. Renovate Main Building Phase 2 Ashland CTC \$34,000,000**
 This requested project is to renovate and revitalize the original 150,000-square-foot building constructed in 1967 on the College Drive Campus. The building is now in need of major renovation and revitalization to ensure that the college provides a suitable and adequate atmosphere for student learning as well as provides a safe, secure, state of the art facility that supports the mission of KCTCS within northeast Kentucky. (C-PI)
- 9. Renovate Collegewide Facilities Big Sandy CTC \$10,000,000**
 This project is to renovate and upgrade facilities on all Big Sandy Community and Technical College campuses. Upgrades are needed such as replacement of flooring, ceiling and wiring, interior painting, restroom upgrades, elevator upgrades, doors, walkways, and corridors to meet federal guidelines for OSHA, ADA, and EPA. (C-PI)
- 10. Renovate Auditorium Building Hopkinsville CC \$3,700,000**
 The Hopkinsville Auditorium Building (31,704 gross square feet) was built in 1991. With the completion of the new Emerging Technology Building, there are spaces that need to be repurposed. The café and student activities areas will be redesigned in order for the space to be used for workforce/community offerings and academic purposes. (C-O)

- 11. Renovate Technology Campus Madisonville CC** **\$3,400,000**
 The Technology Campus is the oldest property on Madisonville Community College without a major renovation. This proposal would upgrade plumbing, boiler, lighting, window, and electrical requirements as well as enhanced appearance of classrooms and offices. With Adult Education, fire brigade, and alternative school, the building continues to be a viable portion of the college operation while efficiency and safety are marginal. (C-PI)
- 12. Relocate Student Center Henderson CC** **\$3,900,000**
 This project proposes to relocate the services that are currently in the Student Center to other buildings on Henderson Community College's (HCC) campus and to demolish the existing building. The HCC Bookstore, The Grill, and Wellness Center all need to be relocated before the building can be demolished. (C-O)
- 13. Renovate and/or Construct Classroom Center Gateway CTC** **\$13,400,000**
 This project supports the continued development of the Gateway Community and Technical College - Urban Metro Campus Master Plan. This project will include developing space for workforce training programs in downtown Covington, Kentucky. Based on a study to be performed, either a total renovation of the Two Rivers Classroom Center needs to be undertaken or if more cost efficient a new building needs to be constructed to replace the building. (C-O)
- 14. Renovations Main Campus West Kentucky CTC** **\$7,000,000**
 The intent of this project is to do several minor renovations at the West Kentucky Community and Technical College Main Campus including masonry repairs at Allied Health Building and resurfacing of parking lots. (C-PI)
- 15. Replace HVAC System Phase 1 Owensboro CTC** **\$4,100,000**
 This project is the first phase of a three-phase project, which once completed, will retrofit the OCTC Main Campus HVAC system using efficient, sustainable technology. It will allow for the proper conditioning of the building and alleviate the periodic breakdowns and piecemeal repair of a system. This project will directly impact the operation of the main campus which is another reason to split it into three phases. (C-PI)
- 16. Upgrade HVAC Equipment and Controls Hazard CTC** **\$3,600,000**
 The intent of this project is to replace or upgrade HVAC equipment and temperature controls in the facilities of Hazard Community and Technical College Technical Campus. The buildings included are the Heavy Equipment Building, the Devert Owens Building, the Walter Prater Building, and the Industrial Education Building. (C-PI)
- 17. Construct Advanced Education Building Somerset CC North** **\$29,500,000**
 Construct an approximately 75,000-square-foot Advanced Manufacturing and Technology Building at Somerset Community College, North Campus. This building will support the expansion of technical programs, such as industrial and engineering technology, additive manufacturing, and machine tool technology. (C-O)
- 18. Construct Student/Classroom Bluegrass CTC Newtown** **\$30,000,000**
 The intent of this project is to construct a 60,000-square-foot building on the Bluegrass Community and Technical College (BCTC), Newtown Campus. This facility will house general education classrooms, labs, faculty/staff offices, administrative offices, and other auxiliary spaces. This will allow BCTC to move programs from their existing facilities on the UK Campus. (C-O)
- 19. Renovate Academic Building Hopkinsville CC** **\$14,300,000**
 This project proposes to renovate the Academic Building on the Hopkinsville Community College campus. The Academic Building is the oldest facility on campus, built in 1964 with 53,000 square feet. We have recently upgraded electrical and HVAC, but this building still needs some updating and improvements. There are 21 classrooms in this building and they all need new windows, flooring, ceiling tiles, soundproofing, and paint. The restrooms also need some updating, including some ADA updates. (C-PI)

- 20. Construct Transportation Training Center Ashland CTC** **\$5,500,000**
 This project is to construct an approximate 22,000-gross-square-foot building at the Ashland CTC Technology Drive Campus. The programs would be moved from Roberts Drive Campus. This project is identified in the college's master plan, combining all technical programs in one location for easy access for students and staff to access to college services, programs, and supporting staff. This phase would be located adjacent to the existing Technology Drive Campus at EastPark. (C-O)
CPAB Staff Notes
 – NEW project – has not been listed in a previous capital plan.
- 21. Construct Muhlenberg Campus Phase 2 Madisonville CC** **\$13,900,000**
 This project will make all provision for the design and construction of Phase 2 of the Madisonville CC, Muhlenberg County Campus. (C-O)
- 22. Renovate Science Labs Jefferson CTC** **\$7,300,000**
 This project will renovate the science laboratories at the Jefferson CTC and Southwest Campuses. There are nine laboratories at the Downtown Campus and six laboratories at the Southwest Campus. These laboratories have had no major renovation since their construction in 1980. (C-PI)
- 23. Renovate Purchase Allied Health Hazard CTC** **\$15,800,000**
 This project purposes to purchase or renovate approximately 40,000 gross square feet of space in Hazard, Kentucky to be used as lecture and lab space for its health sciences programs. (C-PI)
- 24. Procure Postsecondary Education Center Phase 2 Maysville CTC** **\$6,900,000**
 KCTCS proposes to procure a building for Phase 2 of a Regional Postsecondary Education Center on the new Rowan County Campus of Maysville Community and Technical College. Phase 2 would consist of an approximate 35,000-gross-square-foot building, which would house the following programs: HVAC, Welding, Construction, Diesel and Mechanic, and Auto Mechanic. (C-O)
- 25. Construct Allied Health Building Henderson CC** **\$18,600,000**
 Construct an approximate 46,000-gross-square-foot facility at Henderson Community College. This facility will consolidate nursing and allied health programs that are currently spread across campus in three buildings, into one building. (C-O)
- 26. Construct Technology Education Building Somerset CC Laurel North** **\$24,900,000**
 Construct an approximately 75,000-square-foot Technical Education Building on the Laurel North Campus to expand and increase technical program offerings. This new facility would allow for the relocation of the remaining technical programming from the Laurel South Campus and the expansion of offerings in manufacturing technologies. (C-O)
- 27. Renovate Learning Resource Center Ashland CTC** **\$6,700,000**
 The intent of this project is to renovate the Learning Resource Center on the College Drive Campus of Ashland Community and Technical College (ACTC). The renovations will focus on replacing the windows, upgrading plumbing systems, installing new storefronts, and updating interior finishes. (C-PI)
- 28. Construct Student Learning Center Hopkinsville CC** **\$20,900,000**
 This facility will enable the college to provide new general education classroom space with up-to-date labs on the Hopkinsville Campus. The Student Learning and Activities Center will also include collaborative learning spaces for students and space for the upward bound program. The center will also include flexible general meeting space with a combination of small and large conference rooms. (C-O)
- 29. KCTCS Information Technology Pool** **\$9,500,000**
 This project is to expand and upgrade the current KCTCS information technology infrastructure, particularly to leverage the 10GB connectivity coming via the Kentucky Wired project. These infrastructure improvements are necessary to expand higher education, promote economic development in communities, and provide access to local, statewide, national, and international resources. (IT)
