OVERVIEW

The Tourism, Arts, and Heritage Cabinet's mission is to capitalize on the natural assets of the state and draw from resources in business development, tourism, outdoor attractions, arts, and cultural heritage. The following agencies within the cabinet report proposed projects in their 2022-2028 capital plans:

- The <u>Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources</u> maintains a system to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife resources and provide wildlife-related activities. Department operations and projects are supported with agency restricted funds generated from user fees (licenses and permits), donations, and federal grants.
- The <u>Department of Parks</u> provides stewardship of the state's land, cultural, and natural resources and manages the state resort parks, recreational parks, and historic sites. The department is responsible for 45 state parks with a total of 45,000 acres of land and water owned or leased by the Commonwealth.
- The <u>Kentucky Artisan Center at Berea</u> opened in July 2003, and is located on 10 acres just off Interstate 75 at exit 77. The center's 25,000 square foot facility serves as a Kentucky craft retail and dining destination, and is a gateway to attractions and experiences across the state. The center is open daily with no admission charge and draws up to 290,000 visitors annually.
- The <u>Kentucky Center for the Arts</u> in Louisville houses three performance halls, rehearsal spaces, and function rooms, and is the home for numerous community arts groups. Other than producing its own series of performances, the facility also partners with organizations and programs to administer a thriving education and community arts mission, including Governor's School for the Arts, Arts in Healing, School Programs, and ArtsReach.
- The <u>Kentucky Heritage Council/State Historic Preservation Office</u> was established in 1966. Its mission is to identify, preserve, and protect the cultural resources of Kentucky. Through its various programs, the agency endeavors to show how historic resources contribute to the heritage, economy, and quality of life of all Kentuckians.
- The <u>Kentucky Historical Society</u> oversees three historic sites-the Center for KY History, the Old State Capital, and the KY Military History Museum. The mission of KHS is to educate and engage the public through Kentucky history in order to meet the challenges of the future.
- The <u>Kentucky Horse Park</u>, comprised of 1,224 acres, over 110 structures, 40 miles of fencing, and 260 campsites, provides an equine theme park, campground, equine office complex, and the National Horse Center, and hosts a number of equestrian and non-equine events annually.
- The <u>State Fair Board</u> in Louisville manages properties entrusted to it by the Commonwealth in order to provide recreational opportunities for its citizens and to stimulate economic development. This mission is fulfilled through the board's two major facilities: the Kentucky Exposition Center and the Kentucky International Convention Center. The board's clientele includes ordinary citizens who use the facilities for a wide variety of public events, such as the State Fair, sporting events, and concerts, as well as specific interest groups who hold their trade shows and conventions at its facilities in Louisville.

The five maintenance pools are the priority. As in previous capital plans, the Tourism, Arts, and Heritage Cabinet is focused on assuring the physical assets of the Commonwealth that are under its care remain safe and enjoyable for both in-state and out-of-state visitors. Maintenance pools fund prevention and assure the agencies are good stewards of the state's treasures.

All of the cabinet's infrastructure, from 90 year old park lodges and 35 year old horse park roofs, to State Fair exposition facilities get excessive use. Wear on these structures not only presents a poor impression of the state, but creates hazards such as the electrical fires from roof leaks that have happened in recent history.

This proposal has a request for a new maintenance pool specifically for the facility housing the Artisan Center at Berea. This architecturally unique building is a visitors' rest stop, gift shop, and café on the I-75 corridor that is a first impression of Kentucky for many tour buses. The building is aging and in significant need of the continual repair that comes with high traffic public areas.

Additionally, the plan prioritizes projects that have a quick ability to produce revenue. Campgrounds are a prime example of capital investments that produce a substantial return with minimal risk. The Kentucky Horse Park campground, as well as several state park locations, have demand that justifies the requested investment.

The 2020-2022 Executive Budget authorized a \$10 million bond-funded maintenance pool. To date, approximately \$3 million has been expended on various state park projects. The budget also authorized a \$10 million bond-fundled Wastewater Treatment and Infrastructure Upgrades Pool. Projects are ongoing at Cumberland Falls, Natural Bridge, and Lake Barkley.

KY Artisans Center Priority #1 (C-PI) <u>CPAB Staff Notes</u> NEW project – has not been listed in a previous capital plan. The Kentucky Artisan Center is a complex of nearly 25,000 square feet. The facility was opened to the public in 2003. Since that time, 18 years have passed and the building is in dire need of major renovations and repair. 	
4	Maintenance Pool, Kentucky Center for the Arts	 This pool provides the agency with monies to perform special maintenance and deferred maintenance. This is a vital need for the Kentucky Center to protect the Commonwealth's investment in existing facilities. KY Center for the Arts Priority #1 (C-PI) <u>CPAB Staff Notes</u> Additional GF of \$1 million are proposed for 2024-26 and 2026-28. The Kentucky Center generates approximately 68% of its total revenues through a variety of sources, including facility rentals, ticket sales and surcharges, concessions, and private fundraising activities. Revenues for the 2018-2020 biennium are reported as \$29,214,264. Of this amount, \$456,526 was allocated to three projects: Main Lobby Lighting Upgrade, \$417,807; Bomhard Elevator Pump Replacement, \$30,786; and North Lobby Hearing Assist Equipment, \$7,933. 	

5	Miscellaneous Major	Maintenance projects costing less than \$1 million occur at the Kentucky	\$6,000,000
	Maintenance Pool, Kentucky State Fair Board	 International Convention Center and the Kentucky Exposition Center facilities and the surrounding properties. It is critical to address these problems in a timely manner. Projects are initiated based on safety, aesthetics, mechanical, functionality and/or efficiencies. Industry standards support a budget of \$5 per square foot per fiscal year for maintenance alone. The Kentucky Exposition Center has 1.2 million square feet under roof, and this pool will only begin addressing critical needs for the facility. KY State Fair Board Priority #1 (C-PI) <u>CPAB Staff Notes</u> Additional GF of \$6 million are proposed for 2024-26 and 2026-28. The current budget appropriation for the maintenance pool is \$3 million bond funds. 6	Expand Campground	 The requested project proposes to add up to 100 new campsites, two bathhouses, a store, and associated infrastructure to the existing 260-site campground. This project plans to substantially increase KHP revenue by meeting this demand with additional campsites including much requested pull-through sites designed for today's larger recreational vehicles. The land earmarked for this expansion is owned by the Commonwealth, adjacent to the existing full-service campground sites. This land has some sewage and electrical lines that the park can use for this expansion. KY Horse Park Priority #2 (C-O) CPAB Staff Notes This project will result in additional revenues to the park. The new sites will rent for approximately \$30+ per night, plus increased laundry and campground store sales. Dept. of Parks Priority #13 (C-PI) <u>CPAB Staff Notes</u> The project will include new/replacement utilities (water, sewer, electric, TV cable, internet, etc.), larger sites to accommodate newer RVs, and road and drainage improvements. Project Status is identified as one of the following:

- <u>Design/Phase C</u> construction document development.
- In Construction between construction contract award and substantial completion.
- <u>Complete/In Warranty</u> Certification of substantial completion has been received from the A/E and the contractor warranty period has not yet expired.
- <u>Complete/Not Closed Out</u> The scheduled closeout date for the project account has been exceeded (13 months after substantial completion), but the project account has not yet been closed.
- <u>Construction/Multiple Bid Packs</u> For projects that have multiple bid packages. It is used only after at least one of the bids has been awarded and construction is underway. After all bid packs have been awarded, the Status changes to "In Construction."

IT project phases are follows:

- Initiation definition of a new project or a new phase of existing project.
- <u>*Planning*</u> establishment of project scope, objectives, and course of action.
- <u>Execution and Control</u> activities to fulfill project specifications.
