AGENCY MISSION AND PROGRAMS

Pursuant to KRS Chapter 40, the Kentucky Dept. of Veterans Affairs (KDVA) is responsible for providing services to Kentucky's 300,000+ Veterans. KDVA is responsible for counseling and assisting veterans in applying for the state and federal benefits which they and their families may be entitled. These benefits include educational, training, and retraining services; health, rehabilitation, housing services; employment services; and financial assistance as may be provided for in federal, state, and local laws. Effective Dec. 16, 1998, responsibility for operating the Kentucky State Veterans Nursing Homes was transferred to KDVA. KRS 40.315, enacted during the 1998 Regular Session, directs that the KDVA establish, operate, and maintain State Veterans Cemeteries.

KDVA carries out its responsibilities of various programs and a centralized support staff:

- Commissioner's Office in Frankfort has executive, management, and support staff.
- State Programs Division: Homeless Veterans, Women's Veterans and KYVets located in the Frankfort
 office
- Benefits Division: 21 offices across the Commonwealth to assist veterans in obtaining benefits.
- Office of Kentucky Veterans Centers operates four State Veterans homes (SVH) providing skilled nursing care and services for Kentucky veterans. The facilities are:
 - o Thomson-Hood Veterans Center, 285 beds in Wilmore (Jessamine County) built in 1992;
 - Paul Patton Eastern Kentucky Veterans Center, 120 beds in Hazard (Perry County) built in 2002:
 - Eddie Ballard Western Kentucky Veterans Center, 120 beds in Hanson (Hopkins County)
 built in 2002 with 36 additional beds added in 2013 for a total of 156 beds;
 - Carl M Brashear Radcliff Veterans Center, 120 beds in Radcliff (Hardin County) built in 2017.
 - A new 60 bed State Veterans Home in Bowling Green (Warren) is currently in the construction phase, estimated completion August 2024.

• Cemeteries Division:

- Kentucky Veterans Cemetery West (KVCW) in Hopkinsville, opened 2004, with 80 total acres;
- Kentucky Veterans Cemetery Central (KVCC) in Radcliff, opened 2007, with 99 total acres;
- Kentucky Veterans Cemetery North (KVCN) in Williamstown, opened 2008, with 97 total
- Kentucky Veterans Cemetery Northeast (KVCNE) in Grayson opened 2010, with 79 total acres:
- Kentucky Veterans Cemetery Southeast (KVCSE) in Hyden opened 2018, with 43 total acres.
- The US Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) awarded the state grants covering 100% of the construction costs.

The Kentucky Department of Veterans Affairs (KDVA) has two distinct programmatic areas that have capital related needs - Veterans Cemeteries and Veterans Centers.

KDVA has received grants from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to construct cemeteries in regions of the Commonwealth in which Veterans require greater access to Veterans Cemeteries. KDVA oversees five State Veterans Cemeteries in Hopkinsville, Radcliff, Williamstown, Grayson, and Hyden. These grants pay 100% of the cemetery construction costs (site development/admin and maintenance buildings), but do not cover land acquisition. VA grants provide 100% of the cost of renovations/expansions; however, continued maintenance of the grounds and facilities is not covered and is an expense of the state. The Veterans Cemeteries Division is requesting two projects in FY2024 for Columbarium Wall Expansions in our cemeteries located in Radcliff and Hopkinsville. Both projects are funded 100% by the Federal Government.

KDVA owns and operates four Veterans Nursing Homes providing skilled long-term nursing care for Kentucky veterans in Central, Eastern, and Western Kentucky. The VA allows state veterans nursing homes to apply for construction, renovation, and expansion grants. The Office of the Kentucky Veterans Centers is requesting a total of nine projects over the upcoming six years including two roof replacements, an HVAC complete system replacement, a fire system replacement, two parking lot renovations and three large interior/exterior renovation projects. Thompson Hood Veterans Center (THVC), Eastern Kentucky Veteran Center (EKVC), Western Kentucky Veteran Center (WKVC) are all dated facilities, twenty to thirty years old, that require much needed repairs and renovations. These repairs are needed in order to comply with federal regulations and ensure a safe environment for the residents.

KDVA also requests continuance of its maintenance pool funding, along with a slight increase in funding. The Cemeteries are in need of maintenance funds to maintain the properties as required by Federal law. The nursing facilities are 24/7 operations which must meet certain federal and state operational regulations in order to remain open and provide care to residents. As buildings age and regulations change, more maintenance will be required for this type of skilled nursing care setting.

Radcliff HVAC System Replacement

1. 2024-2026 Maintenance Pool KDVA

\$2,000,000

Maintenance Pool Funds for KY Department of Veterans Affairs will be used to address various maintenance projects. Maintenance pool funds are used for building and grounds maintenance and repairs and replacement of equipment at both the Veterans Centers and the Veterans Cemeteries. (C-PI) <u>CPAB Staff Notes</u>

- Maintenance pools in the amount of \$2,000,000 are planned for 2026-28 and 2028-30 also.
- Current appropriation for Maintenance Pool is \$800,000 in each fiscal year of the biennia.

2. WKVC - Fire System Replacement

\$1,500,000

Western Kentucky Veterans Center (WKVC) is a 156 bed veterans nursing facility. WKVC is requesting replacement of the fire system. 902 KAR 20:310 and Title 38 Section 51.200(VA regulations) provide requirements for structural specifications for nursing facilities. (C-PI) 3 EKVC –

CPAB Staff Notes

- -New Project has not been listed in a previous capital plan.
- -WKVC is requesting a complete replacement of the fire alarm systems in each of the 4 facilities to include smoke detectors, heat detectors, CO detectors, duct detectors, audio visual devices, strobes, horns, main fire panels, user annunciator panels, extender panels, relays, pull stations, valve indicating devices, tamper switches, and wiring to remain compliant with the nursing facility industry regulations.

3. Roof Replacement \$1,500,000

Eastern Kentucky Veterans Center (EKVC) is a 120 bed veterans nursing facility. EKVC is requesting complete roof replacement. 902 KAR 20:310 and Title 38 Section 51.200(VA regulations) provide requirements for structural specifications for nursing facilities. (C-PI)

CPAB Staff Notes

- -New Project has not been listed in a previous capital plan.
- -would cover 55,000 sq. ft. of roofing on a two-story facility. The current roof's 20-year warranty ended in 2022.

4. THVC - Exterior Lighting Replacement

\$1,500,000

Thomson-Hood Veterans Center (THVC) is a 285 bed veterans nursing facility. THVC is requesting parking lot light replacement. 902 KAR 20:310 and Title 38 Section 51.200(VA regulations) provide requirements for structural specifications for nursing facilities. (C-PI)

CPAB Staff Notes

- -New Project has not been listed in a previous capital plan.
- -Project would replace all existing exterior lighting & lighting poles around the campus, driveway and parking lots. Some of the current concrete bases and poles have become a hazard.

5. WKVC - Roof Replacement

\$1,500,000

Western Kentucky Veterans Center (WKVC) is a 156 bed veterans nursing facility. WKVC is requesting replacement of the roof of the main building. 902 KAR 20:310 and Title 38 Section 51.200(VA regulations) provide requirements for structural specifications for nursing facilities. (C-PI)

CPAB Staff Notes

- -New Project has not been listed in a previous capital plan.
- -This project would complete replacement of the roof on the main building with a metal or rubberized roof system, with at least a 20-year Warranty.

6. THVC - Interior/Exterior Renovations

\$7,000,000

Thomson-Hood Veterans Center (THVC) is a 285 bed veterans nursing facility. THVC is requesting interior and exterior renovations which include the remodeling of all the residents, staff and public bathrooms, replacement of the nursing stations. Exterior building renovations are needed as well. 902 KAR 20:310 and Title 38 Section 51.200(VA regulations) provide requirements for structural specifications for nursing facilities. (C-PI)

CPAB Staff Notes

- -This project was listed in the 2022-2028 Capital Plan as "THVC Interior Renovation", but the agency has added exterior renovation needs to the scope of the project.
- -This project involves extensive interior/exterior renovations. Current facility interior/exterior surfaces and materials are nearing or past their intended lifespan.

Project Status is identified as one of the following:

- <u>Awaiting Initiation by Agency</u> this project has not yet been started either because the agency for which the project was authorized has not yet contacted the Finance and Administration Cabinet or the HB 622 institution has not yet initiated the project through its internal procedures.
- <u>Planning</u> in house activity prior to A/E selection. For projects financed from restricted, federal, or "other" funds, this category is not to be used until those funds have been awarded or received.
- <u>Design/Phase A</u> schematic design.
- <u>Design/Phase B</u> design development.
- <u>Design/Phase C</u> construction document development.
- <u>Construction/Multiple Bid Packs</u> this category is only for projects that have multiple bid packages. It is to be used only after at least one of the bids has been awarded and construction is underway. After all bid packs have been awarded, the Status should change to "In Construction."
- In Construction between construction contract award and substantial completion.
- <u>Complete/In Warranty</u> certification of substantial completion has been received from the A/E and the contractor warranty period has not yet expired.
- <u>Complete/Closed Out</u> project is complete, the warranty period has expired, and the project account has been closed.
- <u>Complete/Not Closed Out</u> the scheduled closeout date for the project account has been exceeded (13 months after substantial completion) but the project account has not yet been closed.
- <u>Cancelled</u> a decision has been made that the project will not or cannot be undertaken and if a project account was established, that account has been closed or reallocated to another project (if indicated).

IT project phases are as follows:

- Initiation definition of a new project or a new phase of existing project.
- Planning establishment of project scope, objectives, and course of action.
- Execution and Control activities to fulfill project specifications.

<u>CPBOC</u> – Project approved by the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee, a statutory committee of the Kentucky General Assembly.

<u>"Pool" Authorization</u> – Project established with an allocation from the agency's maintenance pool and reviewed and/or approved by the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee.
