3	Be i	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4		→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 183 IS CREATED TO
5	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
6	<u>(1)</u>	The aviation development fund is hereby established in the State Treasury as a
7		trust and agency account. The fund shall consist of appropriations of the General
8		Assembly, interest from fund principal, grants, donations, and payments to the
9		fund for any lawful purpose.
10	<u>(2)</u>	The fund shall be administered by the Department of Aviation.
11	<u>(3)</u>	Moneys deposited in the fund shall be used, in accordance with Sections 1 to 3 of
12		this Act, to:
13		(a) Increase Kentuckians' access to educational opportunities within the
14		aviation and aerospace industries by supporting the expansion and
15		acquisition of facilities, equipment, simulators, and related equipment by
16		airports and aviation technical schools in connection with educational
17		institutions, flight schools, and other training programs; and
18		(b) Promote aviation programs throughout the Commonwealth.
19	<u>(4)</u>	The department shall establish a grant program in accordance with Sections 2
20		and 3 of this Act to evaluate proposals and distribute aviation development funds.
21	<u>(5)</u>	The department shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with
22		KRS Chapter 13A regarding procedures for providing grants pursuant to
23		Sections 2 and 3 of this Act.
24	<u>(6)</u>	Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any moneys remaining in the fund at the close of a
25		fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year to be
26		used for the purposes set forth in this section.
2.7	(7)	Any interest earnings of the fund shall become part of the fund and shall not

1		<u>lapse.</u>
2	<u>(8)</u>	Any moneys in the fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes set forth in this
3		Sections 1 to 3 of this Act and shall not be appropriated or transferred by the
4		General Assembly for any other purpose.
5		→SECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 183 IS CREATED TO
6	REA	D AS FOLLOWS:
7	<u>(1)</u>	The department shall establish an aviation development grant program to solicit
8		and evaluate proposed projects and award grants to be funded with moneys from
9		the aviation development fund established under Section 1 of this Act.
10	<u>(2)</u>	Of the money in the aviation development fund at the beginning of each fiscal
11		year, the department may:
12		(a) Award eighty percent (80%) of the funds up to the first five million dollars
13		(\$5,000,000), and any funds in excess of that amount, in grants to proposals
14		which:
15		1. Expand existing programs at educational institutions, flight schools,
16		and other training programs; and
17		2. Establish new programs, but only at public educational institutions;
18		(b) Use fifteen percent (15%), up to a maximum of seven hundred fifty
19		thousand dollars (\$750,000), to develop an innovative aircraft system
20		program which may include unmanned aircraft systems and electric
21		aircraft infrastructure development; and
22		(c) Use five percent (5%) up to a maximum of two hundred fifty thousand
23		dollars (\$250,000), to promote educational programs through targeted
24		outreach and broad-based aviation promotional initiatives.
25	<u>(3)</u>	Grant proposals under this section shall be evaluated by the aviation development
26		grant review committee established under Section 3 of this Act.
27	<i>(4)</i>	Grant proposals under this section shall be evaluated on the follow criteria:

1		(a) The needs of the local workforce;
2		(b) The financial needs of the program and proposed financial participation of
3		the applicant;
4		(c) Geographic coverage;
5		(d) The potential for economic development;
6		(e) The level of financial commitment from the educational institution or
7		vocational training program;
8		(f) The potential for expansion of innovative technologies, such as unmanned
9		aircraft training; and
10		(g) Other criteria established by the department in administrative regulations
11		promulgated pursuant to KRS Chapter 13A.
12	<u>(5)</u>	Applications for grants under this section shall be submitted no later than
13		September 1 of each year and awarded no later than November 1 of the same
14		<u>year.</u>
15	<u>(6)</u>	In any fiscal year that grants are awarded under this section, the department
16		shall submit, prior to the end of that fiscal year, a report to the Interim Joint
17		Committees on Transportation and Appropriations and Revenue that identifies:
18		(a) The amount of money available for grant awards under subsection (2)(a) of
19		this section;
20		(b) The number of grant applicants;
21		(c) The names of grant recipients, along with the amount of each award and a
22		description of the uses of grant money;
23		(d) Information on the current status of the projects awarded this year;
24		(e) Information on the status of grants awarded in previous years for which the
25		awards have not been expended; and
26		(f) Information on how the moneys identified in subsection (2)(b) and (c) of
27		this section were spent.

1		→ SECTION 3. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 183 IS CREATED TO
2	REAI	D AS FOLLOWS:
3	<u>(1)</u>	As used in this section "committee" means the Aviation Development Grant
4		Review Committee.
5	<u>(2)</u>	The Aviation Development Grant Review Committee is hereby established. The
6		committee shall evaluate grant applications and award grants in accordance with
7		Section 2 of this Act.
8	<u>(3)</u>	The committee shall be composed of five (5) members, as follows:
9		(a) The commissioner of the Department of Aviation, or the commissioner's
10		<u>designee;</u>
11		(b) The secretary of the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet, or the
12		secretary's designee; and
13		(c) Three (3) citizen members, appointed by the Governor, based on the
14		following qualifications:
15		1. One (1) citizen member who is a commercially rated pilot;
16		2. One (1) citizen member who is a certificated airframe and power plant
17		mechanic with an inspector authorization; and
18		3. One (1) citizen member who has experience in vocational education
19		and job training.
20	<u>(4)</u>	After the initial appointments, citizen members of the committee shall serve terms
21		of four (4) years. Members shall be eligible to succeed themselves and shall serve
22		until their successor is appointed.
23	<u>(5)</u>	Members of the committee shall not be paid for their service as board members,
24		and shall not be reimbursed for any expenses involved in attending board
25		meetings.
26	<u>(6)</u>	The committee shall elect a chair and a vice chair from its members who shall
2.7		serve in those canacities until replaced. A majority of the hoard shall constitute a

1		quorum for the purposes of conducting business. The board shall be subject to
2		the Kentucky Open Records Act, KRS 61.870 to 61.884.
3	<u>(7)</u>	The committee shall meet annually, when called by the chair, or at the request of
4		the secretary of the Transportation Cabinet. The committee shall receive
5		assistance in carrying out its administrative functions from the cabinet and shall
6		be attached to the cabinet for administrative purposes.
7		→SECTION 4. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 183 IS CREATED TO
8	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
9	<u>(1)</u>	The Department of Aviation shall undertake a continuing study of the needs of
10		publicly owned or operated general aviation airports in the Commonwealth for
11		the purpose of bringing existing facilities to acceptable standards or for the
12		replacement of existing facilities when required.
13	<u>(2)</u>	The department shall develop a recommended six (6) year aviation plan that
14		identifies the individual projects or portions thereof that are scheduled to be
15		developed at each publicly owned or operated general aviation airport and are
16		funded in part by the aviation economic development fund established in KRS
17		183.525. The recommended six (6) year aviation plan shall include a
18		recommended biennial aviation development plan. The recommended six (6) year
19		aviation plan and recommended biennial aviation development plan shall be
20		submitted to the General Assembly as required by subsection (6)(f) of Section 6 of
21		this Act. The six (6) year aviation plan shall include but shall not be limited to the
22		following information for each project:
23		(a) The name of the airport;
24		(b) A Kentucky Department of Aviation project identification number;
25		(c) A description of the project and the scope of improvement;
26		(d) The amount of local, state, or federal funds to be used on the project;
2.7		(e) The stage of development for the design and development phase:

1		(f) The fiscal year in which each phase of the project should commence;
2		(g) The estimated cost for each phase of the project; and
3		(h) The estimated cost to complete the project.
4	<u>(3)</u>	The department shall identify projects in the six (6) year aviation plan that may,
5		in accordance with this section, be advanced from later years, to maximize the
6		use of all funds available to the cabinet, and to plan for the historical precedent
7		of projects being delayed due to unforeseen circumstances. As required by
8		Section 6 of this Act, the Governor shall submit to the General Assembly, as part
9		of the proposed biennial aviation development plan, a list of projects from the last
10		four (4) years of the six (6) year aviation plan, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of
11		the recommended biennial aviation development appropriation, which can be
12		advanced if additional money is received and all projects included in the enacted
13		biennial aviation development plan have been advanced or completed to the
14		extent possible.
15	<u>(4)</u>	The department shall, on a quarterly basis, transmit electronically to the General
16		Assembly through the Legislative Research Commission a report on all activity
17		relating to all projects with open activity conducted by the department during the
18		biennium. The data for each project shall contain activity on projects funded
19		through the department, including but not limited to the following:
20		(a) The Kentucky Department of Aviation project identification number;
21		(b) The airport name;
22		(c) Type of work;
23		(d) Description of the project;
24		(e) The year the project was enacted in a six (6) year aviation plan, and the
25		notation "A" if the project is active and the notation "I" if the project is
26		inactive;

1		phase;
2		(g) The original budget estimate and fiscal year each phase is expected to begin
3		as enacted in the six (6) year aviation plan;
4		(h) The name of the contractor, current contract amount, and the current
5		amount earned by the contractor;
6		(i) The estimated date for completion of the project, current percentage of work
7		completed based upon time, and the actual contract completion date;
8		(j) The department's engineer's estimate for the project; and
9		(k) Total expenditures by phase.
10		→SECTION 5. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 183 IS CREATED TO
11	REA	D AS FOLLOWS:
12	<u>(1)</u>	The Department of Aviation shall develop a statewide prioritization process for
13		the use of funds in the aviation economic development fund established in KRS
14		183.525. This prioritization process shall be used for the development of the
15		recommended biennial aviation development plan and the recommended six (6)
16		year aviation plan pursuant to Section 4 of this Act.
17	<u>(2)</u>	The prioritization process shall be based on an objective and quantifiable
18		analysis that considers, at a minimum, the following factors relative to the cost of
19		the project:
20		(a) If runway-related, runway pavement conditions;
21		(b) Age and condition of other airport facilities;
22		(c) Traffic;
23		(d) Proximity to other airports;
24		(e) Potential benefits from technological upgrades; and
25		(f) Economic, educational, and workforce development potential.
26	<u>(3)</u>	(a) The department shall weight the factors used in subsection (2) of this
2.7		section for each of the proposed projects and shall attempt to gauge the

1			potential return on the project investment.					
2	(b) The department shall solicit input from localities, metropolitan planning							
3	organizations, area development districts, and other stakeholders in its							
4	development of the prioritization process pursuant to this section.							
5	Section 6. KRS 48.110 is amended to read as follows:

27	(3)	A st	atement of the surplus in any account and in any special fund of the branch of					

1	government. If a surplus exists in any account of the branch of government the
2	statement shall show the excess of all current assets over all current liabilities as of
3	the beginning of each of the two (2) fiscal years last concluded, and all changes in
4	these accounts during each of such two (2) fiscal years;

- (4) A statement as of the close of the last completed fiscal year and as of the close of 6 the current fiscal year showing, for each budget unit the total funded debt, the value of sinking fund assets, the net funded debt, the floating liabilities as of the end of the current fiscal year, and the total debt as of the close of the last completed fiscal year and as of the close of the current fiscal year;
 - Summary and detailed comparative statements of expenditures itemized by budget (5) unit for each of the two (2) fiscal years last concluded and requests for appropriations by funds or accounts, the budget of the current year, and the recommendations for appropriations for each of the next two (2) fiscal years. Following the lists of actual and proposed expenditures of each budget unit there shall be a detailed explanation of the actual and proposed expenditures, to include activities, beneficiaries and expected results of the programs or services of the budget units;
- 18 A draft of the proposed branch budget bill containing: (6)

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- Recommendations of the branch of government for appropriations for the next two (2) fiscal years, and drafts of such revenue and other acts as may be recommended for implementing the proposed financial plan;
 - (b) Recommended appropriations for extraordinary expenses and capital outlays, which shall be itemized in the proposed branch budget bill for the branch by budget unit. The title of each budget unit shall be worded to limit each appropriation to the specific use or purpose intended;
- 26 (c) A plan for the reduction of the branch budget if there is a revenue shortfall of 27 five percent (5%) or less in the general fund or road fund. In recommending

1		budget reductions, the Governor, the Chief Justice, and the Legislative						
2		Research Commission shall not recommend universal percentage reductions,						
3		but shall weigh the needs of all budget units and shall strive to protect the						
4		highest possible level of service in their respective branches. Services which						
5		are not essential to constitutional functions shall be subject to reduction.						
6		Transfer of funds may be authorized by the budget reduction plan;						
7	(d)	1. A plan for the expenditure of a general fund or road fund surplus of up						
8		to two and one-half percent (2.5%).						
9		2. The plan shall include provisions for the expenditure of a surplus, and						
10		may provide for additional moneys for nonrecurring expenditures for

12		program or service authorized by law for which an appropriation was not

14		3. In lieu of recommending the appropriation of funds, the plan may						
15		instead recommend the retention of surplus funds in the surplus account

18	(e)	1. A recommended state capital projects program and a recommended						
19		program for the purchase of major items of equipment.						
20		2. The recommended capital construction program shall include:						
21		a. A complete list and summary description of each specific capital						
22		construction project recommended for funding during the

25		i. The agency and purpose for which it will be used;

18			ii. The justification for the purchase;
19			iii. The estimated cost of the item, including ancillary expenses
20			and any expenses necessary to make the equipment
21			functional and operational;
22			iv. The recommended sources of funds; and
23			v. The dollar amounts recommended for appropriation and
24			anticipated from every other source of funds for the
25			purchase.
26	7.	All i	nformation required by subparagraph 5. of this paragraph shall be
27		inclu	ded in the executive branch budget recommendation. The branch

1		budget bill for the executive branch shall contain only a complete list of
2		each specific item of major equipment recommended for purchase
3		during the biennium and, for each item, the information specified in
4		subparagraph 6.b.iii., iv., and v. of this paragraph;
5	(f)	The branch budget recommendation for the Transportation Cabinet shall
6		include the following information:
7		1. A separate branch budget bill;
8		2. A recommended biennial highway construction plan, which shall be
9		presented as a separate bill, and which shall include a list of individual
10		transportation projects included in the last four (4) years of the six (6)
11		year road plan, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the recommended
12		biennial highway construction appropriation, which can be advanced if:
13		a. Additional funds are received; and
14		b. All projects included in the biennial highway construction plan
15		have been advanced or completed to the extent possible; [and]
16		3. A recommended biennial aviation development plan, which shall be
17		presented as a separate bill, and which shall include a list of
18		individual projects included in the last four (4) years of the six (6) year
19		aviation plan, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the recommended
20		biennial aviation development appropriation, which can be advanced
21		<u>if:</u>
22		a. Additional funds are received; and
23		b. All projects included in the biennial aviation development plan
24		have been advanced or completed to the extent possible;
25		4. The six (6) year road plan and the six (6) year aviation plan. The
26		Governor shall have ten (10) working days after submission of the
27		branch budget recommendation, [and] the recommended biennial

1				highway construction plan, and the recommended biennial aviation			
2				<u>development plan</u> to submit the six (6) year road plan <u>and the six (6)</u>			
3				year aviation plan. The six (6) year road plan and the six (6) year			
4				aviation plan shall be submitted in a form and format cooperatively			
5				developed by the Transportation Cabinet and the General Assembly and			
6				approved by the Legislative Research Commission; and			
7		(g)	1.	In the executive branch budget recommendation, as a separate section,			
8				an amount sufficient to meet unexpected contingencies or emergencies,			
9				including but not limited to natural or man-made disasters, civil			
10				disorders, court orders requiring or resulting in the expenditure of state			
11				funds, or other related causes.			
12			2.	The amount shall be based on the nature, type, and frequency of named			
13				categories of events which may, from past experience, be reasonably			
14				anticipated.			
15			3.	This portion of the budget recommendation shall detail similar incidents			
16				and the nature and amount of the expenditures for each during the ten			
17				(10) years immediately preceding.			
18		The	total	amount of appropriations recommended from any fund shall not exceed			
19	the c	ash re	esourc	es estimated to be available and to become available to meet expenditures			
20	under the appropriations;						
21	(7)	A ce	ertifica	ate of the branch of government as to the accuracy of the statements of

- Section 8. Of the three initial citizen member appointments to the Aviation

- 15 (3) One member shall be designated to serve a term which expires June 30, 2026.
- After the expiration of the initial appointments, each term shall be for a period of

- → Section 9. Whereas it is appropriate that establishment of a new fund in the
- 19 State Treasury should coincide with the beginning of the Commonwealth's fiscal year, an
- 20 emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by
- 21 the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.

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
