1	A RESOLUTION urging the United States Department of Transportation and the
2	Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration to lessen restrictions and requirements on
3	commercial driver's license holders.
4	WHEREAS, trucking plays a critical role in the United States supply chain and
5	economy, with 72 percent of goods being shipped by truck; and
6	WHEREAS, there is a shortage of qualified drivers with a commercial driver's
7	license (CDL), with estimates that the industry has as many as 78,000 driver openings
8	nationwide; and
9	WHEREAS, the Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) program implemented on
10	February 7, 2022, established the baseline for training required for entry-level drivers and
11	applied to any new applicants to obtain a Class A or Class B CDL for the first time, and
12	to those who wanted to upgrade an existing Class B CDL to a Class A CDL or obtain a
13	first-time school bus, passenger, or hazardous materials endorsement; and
14	WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the House of Representatives and many in the
15	trucking industry that these additional, burdensome requirements of the ELDT program
16	have a negative impact on the ability of trucking companies to hire and maintain the CDL
17	drivers necessary to keep the economy going; and
18	WHEREAS, a person must be 21 years of age to drive a commercial motor vehicle
19	in interstate commerce, a requirement that places an undue burden on employers doing
20	business within the Commonwealth and our neighboring states; and
21	WHEREAS, decreasing the age requirement for utilizing a CDL in interstate
22	commerce from 21 to 18 years of age would increase the number of individuals available
23	for hiring and help with recruitment and retention of these important drivers; and
24	WHEREAS, farm-related services restricted CDLs may currently be used within
25	150 miles of the farmer's farm and are valid for up to 180 days; and
26	WHEREAS, increasing the radius of operation for farm-related services restricted
27	CDLs to 200 miles, and allowing these CDLs to remain valid for 270 days, would greatly

- 1 alleviate the burden on agricultural businesses and small farms throughout the
- 2 Commonwealth; and
- 3 WHEREAS, with the trucking and agricultural industries facing a continual
- 4 shortage of drivers, easing any of these requirements and regulations would allow hiring
- 5 and training to happen in the shortest time possible, would help with retention of drivers,
- 6 and would greatly ease the burden on these employers;
- 7 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 8 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 9 Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- → Section 1. The members of the House of Representatives, individually and
- collectively, hereby urge the United States Department of Transportation and the Federal
- 12 Motor Carrier Safety Administration to:
- 13 (1) Eliminate the entry level driver training program;
- 14 (2) Allow individuals eighteen and older to use their CDL to operate commercial
- motor vehicles in interstate commerce; and
- 16 (3) Expand the farm-related service restrictions to allow for business to be
- 17 conducted within a 200-mile radius for up to 270 days.
- Section 2. The Clerk of the House shall send a copy of this Resolution to Pete
- 19 Buttigieg, United States Secretary of Transportation, and to Jack Van Steenburg,
- 20 Executive Director and Chief Safety Officer for the Federal Motor Carrier Safety
- 21 Administration.
- → Section 3. The Clerk of the House of Representatives is directed to transmit a
- copy of this Resolution to the members of Kentucky's Congressional delegation.
