## UNION COUNTY: LINCOLN SPOKE HERE — AND ONLY HERE

The only known speech Abraham Lincoln gave in his native state took place in September 1840 in Morganfield. Lincoln was stumping for Whig candidate William Henry Harrison in Shawneetown, Illinois, near the Ohio River. George W. Riddell and other Whig supporters heard him and persuaded him to speak at a rally they had planned in Morganfield. History does not record what he said.
