## KHSAL State Championship Tournament

The Kentucky High School Athletic League's first task in 1932 was to set up a state basketball tournament.

The 1932 series took place in Frankfort and drew Louisville Central, Nicholasville Rosenwald-Dunbar, Lawrenceburg Colored, London Colored, Bowling Green State Street, Mt. Sterling Dubois, Danville Bate, Little Rock Training, Elizabethtown Bond-Washington, Hopkinsville Attucks, Frankfort Mayo-Underwood, Lexington Dunbar, Maysville Fee, Winchester Oliver Street, Paris Western and Richmond.

Louisville Central, which played in the state tournament each year through 1955, won the first championship. Mayfield Fee was runner up.

KHSAL instituted sectional tournaments in 1950, with the eight winners advancing to the state tournament.
