Federal Legislation Opens Door for Girls' Return

It took federal legislation to open high school basketball to girls again.

Title IX is a comprehensive federal law that prohibits discrimination based on sex in any federally funded education program or activity. President Richard Nixon signed the law in 1972. Although it applies to more than sports, it opened sports to women and girls at all levels.

Since its passage, the number of girls playing high school sports has grown from 294,000 (in 1971) to 3.4 million (in school year 2016-17). Of the 47,000 girls who played sports in the 2016-17 school year in Kentucky, 5,452 played basketball.*
