Girls Return to Sweet Sixteen®

The Kentucky High School Athletic Association brought back girls' tournament play in 1975. The field that year included schools from all over Kentucky: Middlesboro, Anderson County, Tates Creek, Paducah Tilghman, Monticello, Marion County, Seneca, Sheldon Clark, Newport, Russell, South Hopkins, Owensboro, Barren County, Jenkins, Butler and George Rogers Clark.

Some of those schools had teams for a few years before the 1974-75 school year. Others did not, but even schools with teams apparently did not always have the school's full support. The 1975 Anderson County yearbook noted: "With little support from the school," the team won one invitational tournament and won the District and Regional Tournaments. The state championship went to the Butler Bearettes of Louisville, who beat Barren County 60 to 43.
