Milking It for All It Is Worth

Given that Kentucky is home to many dairy farms, it is not surprising that one of its most beloved events is Cow Days, a festival that began 1973 in Greensburg (Green County).

The origins of the event are somewhat unclear, but by 1979 the fall festival was going strong. That year, the festival was highlighted by a life-size Holstein replica that could be milked. Music, a public square dance, and a marathon also drew many attendees.

In 2023, Cow Days kicked off its 50th anniversary celebration. Held on September 15 and 16 in Greensburg, the bash included live music, inflatables, crafts, and the Cow Days 5K Road Race.

One of the biggest draws at Cow Days is Annie, a replica Holstein made out of fiberglass.
