

511.080 Criminal trespass in the third degree.

- (1) A person is guilty of criminal trespass in the third degree when he or she knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in or upon premises.
- (2) Criminal trespass in the third degree is a violation, unless:
 - (a) The offense occurs during a declared emergency as defined by KRS 39A.020 arising from a natural or man-made disaster, within the area covered by the emergency declaration, and within the area impacted by the disaster; or
 - (b) A person commits a second or subsequent offense within three (3) years of the prior offense;

in which case it is a Class B misdemeanor.
