October 15, 2025

Call to Order and Roll Call

Alternative Delivery Methods for Road Projects

Jason Siwula, Deputy State Highway Engineer, Department of Highways, KYTC; and Chad LaRue, Executive Director, KAHC, presented information on Alternative Delivery Methods for Road Projects.

In response to Representative Branscum, Mr. Siwula said every project is unique with different factors to consider. Oversight of contracts is challenging due to the variations in projects and their particular needs. KYTC utilizes resources to deliver projects in the most efficient way possible.

Chair Douglas said if assistance is needed with changes in legislation, please bring it before the subcommittee for consideration.

In response to Representative Blanton, Mr. Siwula said completion dates are included in all project specifications, both fixed contract completion dates and what is termed working-day contracts in which the completion date is based on actual number of days the contractor is able to work, due to weather and other factors.

In response to Representative Bridges, Mr. Siwula said projects are awarded differently based on the type of contract being used. Mr. LaRue added that the lowest bid is not always accepted, due to differences in technical needs and other issues that are taken into consideration.

In response to Representative Smith, Mr. LaRue said the KAHC is supportive of Alternative Delivery Methods.

Co-Chair Upchurch moved to approve the September 17, 2025 meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Representative Bridges, and the minutes were approved without objection by voice vote.
