On page 3, lines 14 to 16, delete "offer voice service, either directly or through an affiliate, at the requested location. The modifying utility shall not";

- "6. If the requesting customer orders wireless service, the modifying utility shall notify the customer in writing that:
- a. It is providing service using a wireless service provided by the modifying utility or an affiliate; and
- b. The customer may notify the modifying utility in writing at any time that the customer no longer wants the wireless service.
7. If the customer gives written notice under paragraph (c) of this subsection that the wireless service is no longer wanted, the modifying utility, upon request by the customer, shall restore wireline basic local exchange service or IP-enabled voice service at that location. The commission shall have jurisdiction to enforce this obligation on a stand-alone basis.
8. At the time that a customer orders wireless service, the modifying utility shall provide a plain-language description, separate from any consumer or terms of use agreement, as approved by the commission, of whether the wireless service has functional limitations when compared to the current landline service, including whether the wireless service supports remote medical monitoring, any existing alarm system, fax machines, and accurate location identification if 911 is called."
