<b>STATE IMPACT</b> : Class A, B & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$60.38. Most Class D felons are housed in one of 78 full service jails for up to 5 years. DOC's cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$32.92 per day (includes jail per diem, medical & central office costs), not including substance abuse treatment. Projections are based on the daily rate x 365 x number of years.

Potential Impact: Section 1 Would expand the definition of a sex crime in KRS 17.500 to include inchoate offenses conspiracy and solicitation. This bill may increase the number of sex crime convictions and the costs associated with incarceration, the impact is expected to be minimal.				
Section 2. Would extend certain sex offender's registration period. Extending the period of registration has the potential to increase the amount of offenders on supervision; this cost is currently incorporated in the Department of Corrections budget. Although there is a potential of additional Failure to Comply with Sex Offender Registry convictions as a result of extended periods of registration and the costs associated with incarceration, the impact is expected to be minimal.				
This legislation will provide initial progress toward achieving ultimate compliance with the Adam Walsh Act. DOC must continue to pursue compliance in order to preserve Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Funds. The annual 10% penalty that JAG funds are now subject to is recouped and awarded to the Department of Corrections for related Adam Walsh Act activities as long as the agency is actively pursue compliance.
