Part II: Purpose and Mechanics
HB 27 amends KRS 17.545 relating to restrictions on registered sex offenders to add a prohibition against registered sex offenders being on publically owned playgrounds. Registered sex offenders are currently prohibited from residing within 1,000 feet of a publicly owned playground.
Part III: Fiscal Explanation, Bill Provisions, and Estimated Cost
The fiscal impact of HB 27 is indeterminable, but expected to be minimal. Based on information from the Kentucky State Police provided the first of November 2014, the number of registered sex offenders residing in Kentucky was 7,202. Costs under this provision would depend on the number of registered sex offenders arrested for violations of this provision.
A first violation of KRS 17.545 is a Class A misdemeanor. A person convicted of a Class A misdemeanor may be incarcerated for up to one year. Misdemeanants are housed in one of Kentucky's 77 full service jails or five life safety jails. While the expense of housing inmates varies by jail, each additional inmate increases facility costs by an estimated average of \$33.26 per day including medical costs.
