MEASURE’S PURPOSE: The purpose of this measure is to require the Department of Education to develop and maintain a list of child abuse and neglect prevention, recognition, and reporting training for school administrators, certified personnel, and classified personnel and to require local school boards to adopt the developed training.

PROVISIONS/MECHANICS: Section 1 amends KRS 156.095 to direct the Kentucky Department of Education to develop and maintain a list of trainings on child abuse, neglect prevention, recognition, and reporting; identifies the types of trainings that would qualify and what information shall be taught in a qualified training; lists the personnel that shall complete the training; and determines how often the training(s) shall be conducted.

FISCAL EXPLANATION: The Kentucky Department of Education estimates this measure would have an impact. The state cost to develop and maintain the qualified training list should be minimal. The Kentucky Department of Education does not list any specific reasons for costs. The training requirements set forth in the bill can be accessed by local districts via a professional development module available on KDE's website. The reporting requirement set forth in the

provisions of the bill is already required per each local school district's board policy.
