**MEASURE'S PURPOSE**: The bill mandates that students who attend a public school despite not meeting the minimum age requirements be charged the same amount of tuition as other tuition-paying students. The bill also requires those students to be counted as part of the SEEK formula's average daily attendance calculation.

**PROVISIONS/MECHANICS:** Section 1 requires local school boards to ensure that any tuition charged to students who do not meet the state's minimum age requirements for attendance to be the same as students who do meet the requirement. It also states that students who fall under this policy be included in the school's average daily attendance for SEEK calculation purposes.

**FISCAL EXPLANATION:** The portion of the bill dealing with tuition levels would only impact local school districts whose tuition policies for underage students who attend on tuition contracts differ from that of standard-age students. It is unclear how many districts would have to change their tuition policies to meet the new requirement, but regardless, this would only impact the tuition revenues for the affected local school districts.

The second provision, dealing with the average daily attendance calculation for the SEEK

formula, should also have no fiscal impact. Tuition-paying students are currently included in the ADA calculation, so this language clarifies rather than revises the policy.
