WHEREAS, this body honors those individuals in this Commonwealth who go beyond what is required of them in an attempt to make a difference in the lives of Kentuckians who are suffering or in need; and

WHEREAS, Lisa K. Nally-Martin is the founder and president of Working the Puzzle for Autism, Inc., whose goal is to promote autism awareness and provide the families of autism sufferers with the information they need to make their lives and their loved ones' lives more fulfilling and safe; and

WHEREAS, Lisa K. Nally-Martin has also worked to raise funds for Project Lifesaver bracelets for children with autism. Project Lifesaver clients wear a transmitter around their wrist or ankle that emits a tracking signal in order to reduce potential injury due to Alzheimer's- and autism-related conditions or disorders; and

WHEREAS, Lisa K. Nally-Martin is a proud graduate of Bellarmine University and the University of Louisville College of Law; and

WHEREAS, Lisa K. Nally-Martin is an attorney at Mattingly and Nally-Martin, PLLC, and has represented clients in Washington, Marion, and surrounding counties for almost 20 years. She has been the assistant Marion County Attorney since 1996; and

WHEREAS, Lisa K. Nally-Martin is the president of the Springfield/Washington County Chamber of Commerce, and she was awarded the Springfield Business and Professional Women's Club Woman of the Year Award for 1999-2000; and
