

A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and loving memory of Robert J. "Bob" Duncan.

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan was born in Jessamine County on January 15, 1926, the cherished son of the late Robert E. and Mary Elizabeth Holiday Duncan; and

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan attended three years of high school in Nicholasville and his final year at Kentucky Military Institute, where he played football. He later attended the University of Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan was a proud veteran of the United States Army who served in World War II and the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan and his family were prominent members of the Jessamine County community, being the original owners of the property which is now Maple Grove Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan was the fourth-generation operator of Duncan's Menswear on Main Street; and

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan was a member of the Nicholasville Christian Church, Lions Club, and Rotary Club; was a Kentucky Colonel; and was administrator for Wilmore and Jessamine County Planning and Zoning; and

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan departed this earthly life and entered the kingdom of Heaven on March 2, 2015, leaving his family, friends, and all those whose lives he touched in solemn mourning; and

WHEREAS, Bob Duncan was preceded in death by his parents and his son, Robin E. Duncan II. He is survived by his wife of 65 years, Dorothy J. Peel Duncan; his son, Richard Morris Duncan; his grandchildren, Eric Robert Duncan, Heather Duncan Tooley, and Stacey Lynn Duncan Bridgers; and six great-grandchildren;
