

A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and loving memory of Armand Angelucci.

WHEREAS, Armand Angelucci was born in Lexington on August 8, 1920; and

WHEREAS, Armand Angelucci graduated from the University of Kentucky and proudly served his country in World War II, where he was a turret gunner aboard a B-24 bomber; and

WHEREAS, after returning from the war, Armand Angelucci graduated from the University of Kentucky College of Law and served as an Assistant Attorney General for the Commonwealth and as Fayette County Attorney for 12 years; and

WHEREAS, Armand Angelucci was circuit judge from 1970 to 1980, and then was appointed by Governor Wallace Wilkinson to the Kentucky Workers' Compensation Board, where he served for seven years before his retirement; and

WHEREAS, Armand Angelucci was a horseracing enthusiast and had a horse named in his honor: Judge Angelucci, which placed third in the 1987 Breeders' Cup Classic; and

WHEREAS, Armand Angelucci, age 94, departed this earthly life on March 13, 2015, leaving his family, friends, and all those whose lives he had touched in solemn mourning; and

WHEREAS, Armand Angelucci was preceded in death by his wife, Joyce Sowards Angelucci; his son, Fayette County Deputy Sheriff Joseph Angelucci, who was killed in the line of duty on November 4, 1988; his sister, Rosalynd Austin; and his brothers, Phillip J. Angelucci, Jr., and Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci. He is survived by his son, Armand "Mondo" Angelucci, Jr., and his stepson, Frank "Buck" Grow;

***Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

➔Section 1. The Senate hereby expresses its deepest and most profound
