Potential Impact: The proposed legislation makes Strangulation a Class A misdemeanor unless there are aggravating circumstances, in which case it is a Class D felony. This change would increase the number of state inmates DOC is required to incarcerate as well as the length of time they are incarcerated. As there is not data available to calculate how many offenders currently serving an offense for assault involving strangulation, the Department can provide only a possible projection of the cost.
