

A RESOLUTION honoring the 100th anniversary of Louisville Collegiate School.

WHEREAS, Louisville Collegiate School, the first college preparatory all-girls school in Kentucky, was founded in 1915 by William Shallcross Speed and Virginia Perrin Speed; and

WHEREAS, in 1916, Louisville Collegiate School celebrated its first graduation; and

WHEREAS, in 1927, Louisville Collegiate School moved from Ormsby Avenue to its current home on Glenmary Avenue in the historic Cherokee Triangle; and

WHEREAS, in 1973, Louisville Collegiate School committed to a fully coeducational program in grades kindergarten through five; and

WHEREAS, in 1987, Louisville Collegiate School celebrated its first male graduates; and

WHEREAS, today, Louisville Collegiate School inspires academic excellence, extraordinary character, and global citizenship; and

WHEREAS, Louisville Collegiate School remains committed to the four cornerstones of Respect, Honor, Responsibility, and Compassion, resulting in a student body focused on others through community service; and

WHEREAS, Louisville Collegiate School is committed to its progressive roots, fostering excellence in academics, the arts, and athletics; remaining a leader in primary and secondary education; and preparing young Kentuckians to be the next generation of leaders across the Commonwealth of Kentucky, throughout the nation, and worldwide;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

➔Section 1. The House of Representatives pays sincere tribute to this historic institution in the field of education.

➔Section 2. When the House of Representatives adjourns this day, it does so in

honor of the 100th anniversary of the founding of Louisville Collegiate School.
