

A RESOLUTION adjourning the House of Representatives in honor and loving memory of Kentucky State Police Trooper Eric Keith Chrisman.

WHEREAS, Trooper Eric Chrisman was born on September 13, 1991, the cherished son of Randy Keith and Dawn Lynn Adams Chrisman; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Eric Chrisman was a proud graduate of the Christian Academy of Lawrenceburg, Western Kentucky University, and the Kentucky State Police Academy. After his graduation on January 16, 2015, he was assigned to Post #1 in Mayfield, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2015, while responding to a reckless driving complaint in Livingston County, Trooper Eric Chrisman's car crossed into the opposite lane and into the path of a tractor-trailer; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Eric Chrisman, a true son of God and a beloved member of the Kentucky State Police family, departed this earthly life on June 23, 2015, leaving his family, friends, and all those citizens of this great Commonwealth whom he had sworn to protect in solemn mourning; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Eric Chrisman was preceded in death by his grandfather, Terry Lee Chrisman. He is survived by his parents; sister, Emily Kay Powell (Christopher); brother, Evan Kyle Chrisman (Emily); grandparents, Mary Ellen Graves, Coleman Adams (Rita), and Alice Toler Chrisman; and a host of other family members and friends who will dearly miss his presence in their lives;

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
