STATE IMPACT : Class A, B & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$61.09. Most Class D felons are housed in one of 78 full service jails for up to 5 years. DOC's cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$31.92 per day (includes jail per diem, medical & central office costs), not including substance abuse treatment. Projections are based on the daily rate x 365 x number of years.

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Potential Impact: Section 1 The proposed legislation states the chapter related to child pornography shall not apply to Peace officers and other law enforcement personnel processing and viewing the above referenced materials in the course of an investigation or prosecution of a violation of a criminal case. The legislation would also apply to judges, juror and other personnel of the court as well as criminal defense counsel an their personnel, private civil counsel and their personnel, a litigant in criminal or civil litigation. The legislation creates no new felonies.

The section could add protection to Correctional Officers and Probation and Parole officers that may have to handle such materials as a result of an investigation.

LOCAL IMPACT: Local governments are responsible for the cost of incarcerating individuals charged with Class A or B misdemeanors and felony defendants until disposition of the case. While the expense varies by jail, this estimated impact will be based on \$31.34 per day, which equals the per diem and medical that DOC pays jails to house felony offenders.
