SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Amend KRS 525.200 to add elements to the offense of assault on a service animal in the first degree. STATE IMPACT: Class A, B & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$61.09. Most Class D felons are housed in one of 78 full service jails for up to 5 years. DOC's cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$32.51 per day (includes jail per diem, medical & central office costs), not including substance abuse treatment. Projections are based on the daily rate x 365 x number of years. NONE MINIMAL MINIMAL SIGNIFICANT **Projected Impact:** MODERATE Potential Impact: The proposed legislation changes the language around assault on a service animal first degree. Added language includes Intentionally causes physical injury to a service animal by means of a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument. Currently this is a class B misdemeanor. It would be elevated to a Class D felony. Also included is wantonly causes serious physical injury to a service animal by means of a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument. Assault on a Service Animal First Degree is a Class D felony. AOC was contacted for the number of persons charged with Assult on a service animal First Degree. Between CY 2012- 2015 there were 2 cases. 10 Class D Felons cost \$118,660 to \$593,310. A Class D Felony sentence is 1 to 5 years. 100 Class D Felons cost \$1.1M to \$5.9M. 1 Class D Felon costs Ky. \$11,866 to \$59,331. LOCAL IMPACT: Local governments are responsible for the cost of incarcerating individuals charged with Class A or B misdemeanors and felony defendants until disposition of the case. While the expense varies by jail, this estimated impact will be based on \$31.92 per day, which equals the per diem and medical that DOC pays jails to house felony offenders. Projected Impact: NONE MINIMAL MINIMAL ☐ SIGNIFICANT MODERATE Creates no new misdemeanor offenses. The potential number of individuals incarcerated under a Class B misdemeanor could be reduced. It would cause a suspected small increase in the number of felons incarcerated in a local facility for a Class D felony.
