SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Create a new section of KRS Chapter 186A to permit an automotive recycling dealer or secondary metals recycler to purchase a motor vehicle, ten model years or older, without a title if certain requirements are met; direct the Transportation Cabinet to promulgate administrative regulations to set forth standards and forms for such transfers; amend KRS 186A.990 to establish penalties; amend KRS 433.890 to exempt such sales of motor vehicles; amend KRS 186A.215 to conform. STATE IMPACT: Class A, B & C felonies are based on an average daily prison rate of \$61.09. Most Class D felons are housed in one of 78 full service jails for up to 5 years. DOC's cost to incarcerate a felony inmate in a jail is \$32.51 per day (includes jail per diem, medical & central office costs), not including substance abuse treatment. Projections are based on the daily rate x 365 x number of years. NONE MINIMAL MODERATE ☐ SIGNIFICANT **Projected Impact:** The proposed legislation would add elements to the charge of forgery 2nd degree, which is a Class D Felony, Potential Impact: for those who knowingly sell a vehicle subject to an unsatisfied lien to a secondary metals recycler or automotive recycling dealer. As this is an a new crime under Forgery 2nd degree, it is not possible to determine the exact impact. However the impact is expected to be minimal. 10 Class D Felons cost \$118,660 to \$593,310. A Class D Felony sentence is 1 to 5 years. 1 Class D Felon costs Ky. \$11,866 to \$59,331. 100 Class D Felons cost \$1.1M to \$5.9M. LOCAL IMPACT: Local governments are responsible for the cost of incarcerating individuals charged with Class A or B misdemeanors and felony defendants until disposition of the case. While the expense varies by jail, this estimated impact will be based on \$31.92 per day, which equals the per diem and medical that DOC pays jails to house felony offenders.
