MEASURE'S PURPOSE: BR 402/SB 33 requires every public school district ensure that every student receive cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training a minimum of one time while enrolled in grades seven through twelve. The training does not have to be provided by a certified instructor or result in the students being certified in CPR.

PROVISIONS/MECHANICS: The measure creates a new section of KRS Chapter 158 to state the intended benefits of CPR training for students; require local public school districts to provide CPR training to every student a minimum of 1 time while enrolled in grades seven through twelve; requires the training to be based on American Heart Association guidelines, incorporate psychomotor skills, and to make students aware of the purpose of an automated external defibrillator (AED); specifically does not require training to be performed by a certified instructor or result in the student being certified in CPR; allows the waiver of CPR training based on disability; specifically does not require schools to have an AED on the premises.

FISCAL EXPLANATION: The measure has no state fiscal impact. The local school districts will be required to perform the required CPR training. Since the training does not have to be performed by a certified instructor, it will likely be performed by existing staff employed by

local school districts as part of regular curriculum. This would create a minimal or no fiscal impact to the local school districts.
