Violent Offenses require the offender to serve 85% of their sentence to release.

Additionally, there would be costs associated with Sex Offender Conditional Discharge (SOCD). SCOD lasts for 5 years upon release from prison. Any offender who violates SOCD returns to prison and serves the remainder of the SOCD time day for day.

Those offenders charged with a sex crime would have to register on the Sex Offender Registry. This duty would fall to law enforcement to complete and maintain.

<b>LOCAL IMPACT</b> : Local governments are responsible for the cost of incarcerating individuals charged with Class A or misdemeanors and felony defendants until disposition of the case. While the expense varies by jail, this estimated impact will be based on \$31.34 per day, which equals the per diem and medical that DOC pays jails to house felony offenders.
