A JOINT RESOLUTION directing the Transportation Cabinet to designate the Cliff Childers Memorial Highway Pulaski County.

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers passed away June 9, 2010 and is survived by his loving wife of 37 years, Charlene Childers; three children; and six grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers was a lifelong resident of Pulaski County and a graduate of Somerset High School and Campbellsville University; and

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers served in the Kentucky National Guard for 26 years, attained the rank of Colonel, and retired as Brigade Commander of the 149th Infantry in Louisville in 1997; and

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers earned his real estate broker's and insurance licenses and opened his own appraisal office in 1988, where he practiced as a general certified appraiser; and

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers was an entrepreneur and philanthropist, always dedicating his time, money, and efforts to many causes; and

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers served as a member of the board of Somerset Community College, Industrial Foundation, and as President of Eagles Nest Country Club; and

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers was a dedicated Christian and was a Deacon at East Somerset Baptist Church; and

WHEREAS, Cliff Childers was very much loved by his family and friends and is greatly missed;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

→ Section 1. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 1247 in Pulaski County between mile point 0 and mile point 3.95 as the "Cliff Childers Memorial Highway" and shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs denoting this designation.
