

Amend printed copy of HJR 54

On page 1, line 25, through page 2, line 21, by deleting Sections 2 through 5 in their entirety, and inserting in lieu thereof:

" \Rightarrow Section 2. That the Congress of the United States is hereby petitioned to propose the Equal Rights Amendment as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, for submission to the states for ratification, to allow equal rights for all genders across the country.

→Section 3. That the Congress of the United States is hereby petitioned to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, for submission to the states for ratification, enshrining same-sex marriage as a constitutional right.

Section 4. That the Congress of the United States is hereby petitioned to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, for submission to the states for ratification, stating that only individual persons may contribute to a political campaign and that the maximum contribution is 27. Individuals may only donate to campaigns being held in states in which the individuals reside.

Section 5. That the Congress of the United States is hereby petitioned to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, for submission to the states for ratification, stating that in all cases in which five or more employees work for an employer, those employees shall be entitled to collective bargaining rights, and union dues shall be collected from all employees of such employer.

Section 6. That this application constitutes a continuing application in accordance with Article V of the Constitution of the United States until legislatures of at least two-thirds of the several states have made applications for a similar convention under Article V, or the General Assembly acts to withdraw this application.

→Section 7. That the Secretary of State shall transmit certified copies of this Joint Resolution to the President, the Secretary of the United States Senate, the Speaker and the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, the presiding officer in each house of the legislature in each of the states in the union, and to the members of Kentucky's congressional delegation requesting their cooperation.".
