

1 AN ACT relating to the Kentucky State Police and declaring an emergency.

2 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

3 ➔SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 15A IS CREATED TO
4 READ AS FOLLOWS:

5 ***The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet and its agencies may provide state personnel,***
6 ***state property, and other state resources to Trooper Island, Incorporated and the***
7 ***Kentucky State Police Foundation.***

8 ➔Section 2. KRS 16.040 is amended to read as follows:

- 9 (1) The department shall consist of the commissioner and the number of officers,
10 individuals employed as a Trooper R Class, CVE R Class, and civilians, and shall
11 be organized in the manner as the commissioner from time to time determines.
- 12 (2) All persons appointed as officers shall at the time of their appointment:
- 13 (a) Be not less than twenty-one (21)~~[nor more than thirty one (31)]~~ years of age;
- 14 (b) Be of good moral character, and in good health;
- 15 (c) Be citizens of the United States and residents of the Commonwealth; and
- 16 (d) Possess a minimum of sixty (60) hours of credit, or an associate degree, from
17 an accredited college or university, or be a high school graduate with at least
18 two (2) years' experience in the military or in law enforcement.
- 19 (3) The commissioner shall prescribe minimum physical requirements for appointment
20 as an officer of the department and for individuals employed as a Trooper R Class
21 or CVE R Class, and shall conduct~~[such]~~ tests and require~~[such]~~ physical
22 examinations as deemed necessary to determine the fitness and qualification of each
23 applicant. All other qualifications being equal, preference shall be given to veterans
24 of the Armed Forces of the United States in time of war, who were honorably
25 discharged.
- 26 (4) The commissioner shall direct an investigation to be conducted in order to
27 determine an applicant's suitability for employment as an officer. The contents of

1 the investigation shall be subject to the Open Records Act, KRS 61.870 to 61.884
2 and KRS 61.991, except that the identity of any witness or informant involving
3 information relative to this investigation shall remain confidential. The identity of
4 any witness or informant shall be subject to the subpoena power of a court of
5 competent jurisdiction.

6 ➔Section 3. KRS 16.052 is amended to read as follows:

7 (1) The base compensation of officers shall be determined based on years of service
8 and rank, as provided in this section.

9 (2) (a) The years-of-service requirements for the salary schedule for ranks below
10 sergeant are as follows:

11 1. A Trooper is an officer with less than three (3) years of continuous
12 service as a commissioned officer with the department;

13 2. A Senior Trooper shall have:

14 a. At least three (3) years of continuous service as a commissioned
15 officer with the department and sixty (60) college credit hours;

16 b. At least four (4) years of continuous service as a commissioned
17 officer with the department and thirty-two (32) college credit
18 hours; or

19 c. Five (5) years of continuous service as a commissioned officer
20 with the department with no college credit requirement;

21 3. A Trooper First Class shall have at least ten (10) years of continuous
22 service as a commissioned officer with the department; and

23 4. A Master Trooper shall have at least fifteen (15) years of continuous
24 service as a commissioned officer with the department.

25 (b) In addition to meeting the years of service requirements established by
26 paragraph (a) of this subsection, officers listed in the salary schedule for
27 officers below the rank of sergeant shall also meet the requirements for

1 promotion in rank established by the commissioner pursuant to KRS 16.050.

2 (c) Requirements for promotion to sergeant, lieutenant, and captain are as
3 established by KRS 16.055.

4 (3) Any overtime and any salary supplement received from the Law Enforcement
5 Foundation Program pursuant to KRS 15.410 to 15.510 or any comparable
6 supplements received from another funding source shall be in addition to the
7 amounts reflected in the base salary schedules established by subsection (4) of this
8 section.

9 (4) (a) The salary schedules established in this subsection are based on a combination
10 of officer classification and years of service.

11 (b) When "NA" appears in the schedule, it is not possible for an officer to be in
12 that classification and years-of-service combination based upon statutory or
13 regulatory conditions established for promotion or advancement.

14 (c) Salary increases based on years of service shall be effective on the first day of
15 the month during which the anniversary of the officer's appointment as a
16 commissioned Kentucky State Police officer falls.

17 (d) Salary increases based on promotion to a higher rank shall be effective on the
18 first day~~[of the month following the date]~~ the officer is promoted.

19 (e) If an officer is reverted to a previous rank, the officer's salary shall be adjusted
20 to the salary reflected in the base salary schedule for the officer's applicable
21 number of years of service and rank. The adjustment shall take effect the first
22 pay period following the pay period in which the reversion occurs.

23 (f) The base salary for a Cadet Trooper shall be thirty-five thousand dollars
24 (\$35,000).

6 (5) Beginning on July 1, 2018, the salary schedule established by subsection (4) of this
7 section shall be adjusted annually to incorporate any increase in the nonseasonally
8 adjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers, U.S. city average, all items,
9 published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

10 (6) The salary schedules shall be applied to officers employed by the department on
11 July 15, 2016, as follows:

12 (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection:

13 1. Any officer whose base salary exceeds the amount established for his or
14 her years of service and rank in subsection (4) of this section shall retain
15 his or her base salary and shall not receive an increase under the salary
16 schedule until the officer's years of service and rank require a higher
17 base salary than the base salary he or she was receiving on July 15,
18 2016; and

19 2. Any officer whose base salary is below the amount established for his or
20 her years of service and rank in subsection (4) of this section shall
21 receive the base salary he or she qualifies for under the salary schedule
22 for the pay period beginning August 1, 2016; and

23 (b) Any officer who is receiving compensation under KRS 16.165 shall not
24 receive any years of service or rank increases during any period that he or she
25 is receiving compensation under KRS 16.165.

26 (7) The commissioner may establish additional ranks beyond those provided in the
27 salary schedules established by this section, including the ranks of major, lieutenant

1 colonel, colonel, and executive security detail. If the commissioner establishes any
2 of these ranks, the commissioner shall set forth in a policy the conditions under
3 which an officer may be promoted to the rank, and the salary that the officer will
4 receive while serving in that rank.

5 ➔Section 4. KRS 16.080 is amended to read as follows:

6 (1) The commissioner shall promulgate administrative regulations for the enlistment,
7 training, discipline, *code of ethics*, and conduct of officers of the department and
8 individuals employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class, and the commissioner
9 may promulgate administrative regulations for the governing and operation of the
10 department as appear to him or her reasonably necessary to carry out the provisions
11 of KRS 16.010 to 16.170. *Pursuant to KRS 11A.015, this exempts the individuals*
12 *subject to chapter 16 from application of KRS Chapter 11A.*

13 (2) The commissioner may require any officer, individual employed as a Trooper R
14 Class or CVE R Class, or civilian who receives or disburses public funds in the
15 course of his or her duties to file a bond, conditioned that he or she will honestly,
16 correctly, and according to law, receive, disburse, and account for all public moneys
17 coming into his or her hands. The commissioner, each officer, and each individual
18 employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class, shall execute a bond to the
19 Commonwealth of Kentucky in the sum of not less than two thousand dollars
20 (\$2,000), conditioned upon the faithful discharge of his or her duties. The premium
21 on the bonds shall be paid by the department. The commissioner, each officer of the
22 department, and each individual employed as a Trooper R Class or CVE R Class
23 shall, before entering upon the discharge of their official duties, take the
24 constitutional oath of office.

25 (3) Subject to the provisions of KRS 56.440 to 56.550, the commissioner, with the
26 approval of the Governor and the secretary of the Finance and Administration
27 Cabinet, may acquire real estate or interests therein, by purchase, lease, or

1 otherwise, necessary for the purposes of the department, and, with like approval,
2 provide for the acquisition or construction of necessary buildings and other
3 permanent structures and facilities. Title to any real estate acquired shall be taken in
4 the name of the Commonwealth.

5 ➔Section 5. Whereas recruitment of law enforcement officers to the Department
6 of Kentucky State Police is critically important for public safety in the Commonwealth,
7 an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval
8 by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming law.
