- 3 → Section 1. KRS 311.856 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 A supervising physician shall:
- 5 (1) Restrict the services of a physician assistant to services within the physician
- 6 assistant's scope of practice and to the provisions of KRS 311.840 to 311.862;
- 7 (2) [Prohibit a physician assistant from prescribing or dispensing controlled substances;
- 8 (3) Inform all patients in contact with a physician assistant of the status of the
- 9 physician assistant;
- 10 (3)[(4)] Post a notice stating that a physician assistant practices medicine or
- osteopathy in all locations where the physician assistant may practice;
- 12 (4)[(5)] Require a physician assistant to wear identification that clearly states that he
- or she is a physician assistant;
- 14 (5)[(6)] Prohibit a physician assistant from independently billing any patient or other
- payor for services rendered by the physician assistant;
- 16 (6)[(7)] If necessary, participate with the governing body of any hospital or other
- licensed health care facility in a credentialing process established by the facility;
- 18 (7) $\frac{(8)}{(8)}$ Not require a physician assistant to perform services or other acts that the
- 19 physician assistant feels incapable of carrying out safely and properly;
- 20 (8)[(9)] Maintain adequate, active, and continuous supervision of a physician
- 21 assistant's activities to assure that the physician assistant is performing as directed
- and complying with the requirements of KRS 311.840 to 311.862 and all related
- 23 administrative regulations;
- 24 (9)[(10)] Review and countersign a sufficient number of overall medical notes written
- by the physician assistant to ensure quality of care provided by the physician
- assistant and outline the specific parameters for review of countersignatures in the
- application required by KRS 311.854. Countersignature requirements shall be

without specific approval.

A physician assistant may initiate evaluation and treatment in emergency situations

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1	(4)	A physician assistant may prescribe and administer all <i>controlled and</i> nonscheduled
2		legend drugs and medical devices as delegated by the supervising physician. A
3		physician assistant who is delegated prescribing authority may request, receive, and
4		distribute professional sample drugs to patients.

- 5 (5) A physician assistant shall not submit direct billing for medical services and 6 procedures performed by the physician assistant.
- 7 (6) A physician assistant may perform local infiltrative anesthesia under the provisions
 8 of subsection (1) of this section, but a physician assistant shall not administer or
 9 monitor general or regional anesthesia unless the requirements of KRS 311.862 are
 10 met.
- 11 (7) A physician assistant may perform services in the offices or clinics of the 12 supervising physician. A physician assistant may also render services in hospitals or 13 other licensed health care facilities only with written permission of the facility's 14 governing body, and the facility may restrict the physician assistant's scope of 15 practice within the facility as deemed appropriate by the facility.
- 16 (8) A physician assistant shall not practice medicine or osteopathy independently. Each
 17 physician assistant shall practice under supervision as defined in KRS 311.840.

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
