1	AN	ACT relating to prescription drugs.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:	
3	⇒s	ECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 218A IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:	
5	<u>(1) (a)</u>	Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, when issuing a
6		prescription for a narcotic drug to an adult patient for outpatient use for the
7		first time, a practitioner shall not issue a prescription for more than a seven
8		(7) day supply.
9	<u>(b)</u>	A practitioner shall not issue a narcotic drug prescription to a minor for
10		more than a seven (7) day supply at any time and shall discuss with the
11		parent or guardian of the minor the risks associated with opiate use and the
12		reasons why the prescription is necessary.
13	<u>(2) (a)</u>	Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, if, in the professional
14		medical judgment of a practitioner, more than a seven (7) day supply of a
15		narcotic drug is required to treat the adult or minor patient's acute medical
16		condition or is necessary for the treatment of chronic pain management,
17		pain associated with a cancer diagnosis or for palliative care, then the
18		practitioner may issue a prescription for the quantity needed to treat the
19		acute medical condition, chronic pain, pain associated with a cancer
20		diagnosis or pain experienced while the patient is in palliative care.
21	<u>(b)</u>	The condition triggering the prescription of a narcotic drug for more than a
22		seven (7) day supply shall be documented in the patient's medical record
23		and the practitioner shall indicate that a nonnarcotic drug alternative was
24		not appropriate to address the medical condition.
25	<u>(3) Thi</u>	s section shall not apply to medications designed for the treatment of
26	<u>sub</u> :	stance abuse or opioid dependence.
