1 AN ACT relating to the Kentucky Economic Development Partnership and 2 declaring an emergency.

- 3 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- 4

Section 1. KRS 154.10-050 is amended to read as follows:

- 5 (1) The secretary shall be the chief executive officer of the Cabinet for Economic
  6 Development and shall possess the professional qualifications appropriate for that
  7 office as determined by the board.
- 8 (2) The board shall set the salary of the secretary *and other executive officers of the*9 *cabinet as determined by the board*, which shall be exempt from state employee
  10 salary limitations as set forth in KRS 64.640.
- 11 (3) The secretary shall be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the cabinet and 12 shall report and submit on an annual basis implementation plans to the board as 13 provided in KRS 154.10-060; submit the strategic plan for economic development 14 to the board in accordance with the provisions of KRS 154.10-120 and 154.10-125; 15 submit program evaluation reports to the board in accordance with the provisions of 16 KRS 154.10-140; carry out policy and program directives of the board; coordinate 17 programs of the cabinet with all other agencies of state government having 18 economic development responsibilities; hire all other personnel of the cabinet 19 consistent with state law; and carry out all other duties and responsibilities assigned 20 by state law.
- (4) The secretary shall prepare and submit the proposed budget of the cabinet to the
  chairman who shall present it to the board for final approval. Upon approval, the
  board shall submit the proposed budget to the Governor's Office for Policy and
  Management.
- (5) The secretary shall be reimbursed for all actual and necessary expenses incurred in
   the performance of all assigned duties and responsibilities.
- 27 (6) The secretary shall give highest priority consideration in marketing, targeting, and

1 recruiting new businesses, in expanding existing businesses, and in recommending 2 state economic development loans, grants, and incentive programs administered by 3 the authority, to Kentucky counties which have had an average countywide rate of 4 unemployment of fifteen percent (15%) or greater in the most recent twelve (12) 5 consecutive months for which unemployment figures are available, on the basis of 6 the final unemployment figures calculated by the Office of Employment and 7 Training within the Department of Workforce Investment within the Education and 8 Workforce Development Cabinet.

9 →Section 2. Whereas it is critical to the economy and citizens of Kentucky to 10 maintain appropriate staffing for the Cabinet for Economic Development at the executive 11 level and to fill those positions as soon as possible in order to attract new business and 12 investment to the Commonwealth, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes 13 effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming 14 law.
