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1	AN ACT relating to school curriculum.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 158 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, the local school district shall provide
6	an essential skills curriculum that teaches skills and characteristics that are
7	critical to success in the workplace to each student kindergarten through grade
8	twelve (12). Each student shall have attained essential skills in order to graduate.
9	The essential skills curriculum shall include but not be limited to instruction on:
10	(a) Adaptability, including an openness to learning and problem solving, an
11	ability to embrace new ways of doing things, and a capability for critical
12	thinking;
13	(b) Diligence, including seeing a task through to completion;
14	(c) Initiative, including taking appropriate action when needed without waiting
15	for direct instruction;
16	(d) Knowledge, including exhibiting an understanding of work-related
17	information, the ability to apply that understanding to a job, and effectively
18	explain the concepts to colleagues in reading, writing, mathematics,
19	science, and technology as required by the job;
20	(e) Reliability, including showing up on time, wearing appropriate attire, self-
21	control, motivation, and ethical behavior;
22	(f) Remaining drug free; and
23	(g) Working well with others, including effective communication skills, respect
24	for different points of view and diversity of co-workers, the ability to
25	cooperate and collaborate, enthusiasm, and the ability to provide
26	appropriate leadership to or support for colleagues.
27	(2) (a) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this Act, the Kentucky

1	Department of Education shall develop an essential skills curriculum for
2	kindergarten through grade twelve (12) and make it available to all school
3	<u>districts.</u>
4	(b) In developing the essential skills program, the department shall collaborate
5	with the School Curriculum, Assessment and Accountability Council, the
6	Council on Postsecondary Education, the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce,
7	and other business and community groups deemed necessary by the
8	<u>department.</u>
9	(c) A local school district may use the curriculum developed by the department
10	or another curriculum that incorporates the standards used by the
11	<u>department.</u>
12	(3) A high school graduate shall be deemed as having attained essential skills if the
13	graduate meets at least three (3) of the following indicators while in school:
14	(a) No more than six percent (6%) of the student's absences per year are
15	<u>unexcused;</u>
16	(b) Completes a work-based learning experience as verified by the student's
17	employer;
18	(c) Completes twenty-five (25) hours of service learning, community service, or
19	extracurricular activities;
20	(d) Demonstrates leadership experience in school government, extracurricular
21	activities, community organizations, or other community service;
22	(e) Completes a dual credit course developed in accordance with KRS 164.098;
23	(f) Submits voluntarily to regular, random drug tests during the student's high
24	school career; or
25	(g) Completes other indicators as identified by the department.
26	→Section 2. KRS 158.645 is amended to read as follows:
27	The General Assembly recognizes that public education involves shared responsibilities

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1	State	e government, local communities, parents, students, and school employees must work			
2	together to create an efficient public school system. Parents and students must assist				
3	schools with efforts to assure student attendance, preparation for school, and involvement				
4	in le	arning. The cooperation of all involved is necessary to assure that desired outcomes			
5	are	achieved. It is the intent of the General Assembly to create a system of public			
6	educ	education which shall allow and assist all students to acquire the following capacities:			
7	(1)	Communication skills necessary to function in a complex and changing civilization;			
8	(2)	Knowledge to make economic, social, and political choices;			
9	(3)	Core values and qualities of good character to make moral and ethical decisions			
10		throughout his or her life;			
11	(4)	Understanding of governmental processes as they affect the community, the state,			
12		and the nation;			
13	(5)	Sufficient self-knowledge and knowledge of his mental and physical wellness;			
14	(6)	Sufficient grounding in the arts to enable each student to appreciate his or her			
15		cultural and historical heritage;			
16	(7)	Sufficient preparation to choose and pursue his life's work intelligently;[and]			
17	(8)	Skills to enable him to compete favorably with students in other states; and			
18	<u>(9)</u>	Essential skills and characteristics that are critical to success in the workplace as			
19		identified in subsection (1) of Section 1 of this Act.			
20		→SECTION 3. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 158 IS CREATED TO			
21	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:			
22	<u>(1)</u>	The Kentucky Department of Education shall develop age-appropriate drug			
23		awareness and prevention standards to be used with students in kindergarten			
24		through grade twelve (12).			
25	(2)	(a) A local school board shall ensure students receive annual instruction within			
26		the existing curriculum on drug awareness and drug prevention.			
27		(b) The instruction may be delivered by using:			

1	<u>1.</u>	The program developed under subsection (1) of this section;
2	<u>2.</u>	An outside group or agency, such as local law enforcement personnel;
3		<u>or</u>
4	<u>3.</u>	A nationally, regionally, or locally recognized drug awareness
5		program.
