16	(c) Banking, including opening and maintaining checking and savings
17	accounts, balancing a checkbook, and understanding other services offered
18	by depository institutions and assessing their quality;
19	(d) Employment, income, and employee benefits;
20	(e) Investing for retirement and other purposes and common investment
21	<u>vehicles;</u>
22	(f) Risk management and insurance, including life, health, disability, and
23	property insurance;
24	(g) How to start a business;
25	(h) Financial decision making;
26	(i) Consumer protections;

19		(j) The judiciary;

25		(p) Major issues facing the government.
26	<u>(3)</u>	(a) Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year and each year thereafter, a

3	<u>(b)</u>	Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, completing a civic literacy

6	<u>(c)</u>	A student pursuing an early graduation program as established in KRS
7		158.142 shall complete the required course prior to his or her graduation.
