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1	AN ACT relating to coverage for fertility preservation services.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF SUBTITLE 17A OF KRS CHAPTER 304
4	IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section, "iatrogenic infertility" means an impairment of fertility
6	by surgery, radiation, chemotherapy, or other medical treatment affecting
7	reproductive organs and processes.
8	(2) Any health benefit plan issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this
9	Act, that provides coverage for cancer-related health care services shall, prior to a
10	medically necessary cancer treatment, also provide coverage for the medically
11	necessary expenses of standard fertility preservation services when the medically
12	necessary cancer treatment may directly or indirectly cause iatrogenic infertility
13	to an insured.
14	(3) The coverage required by subsection (2) of this section:
15	(a) Shall include:
16	1. Evaluation expenses;
17	2. Laboratory assessments; and
18	3. Medications and treatment associated with oocyte and sperm
19	cryopreservation procedures, including costs for first year storage;
20	(b) Shall not include costs associated with:
21	1. Storage of oocytes or sperm after one (1) year; or
22	2. Use of gametes in other procedures, including but not limited to
23	artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization;
24	(c) Shall not be limited to fewer than two (2) attempts to procure potentially
25	viable eggs or sperm per medically necessary cancer treatment that may
26	result in iatrogenic infertility, unless the provider determines that sufficient
27	eggs or sperm were retrieved on the first attempt; and

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1		(d) May be limited to insureds that have reached puberty and do not exceed the
2		age of forty-two (42).
3	<u>(4)</u>	A health benefit plan that provides prescription drug coverage shall also provide
4		coverage for medications associated with oocyte and sperm cryopreservation
5		procedures.
6	<u>(5)</u>	Procedures covered by this section shall:
7		(a) Be performed at a health facility licensed or certified in Kentucky or
8		another state; and
9		(b) If applicable, conform with the guidelines of the American Society of
10		Clinical Oncology and the American Society of Reproductive Medicine.
11		→ Section 2. This Act takes effect on January 1, 2018.
