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AN ACT relating to student health services.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

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→ Section 1. KRS 156.501 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) The Department of Education shall provide leadership and assistance to local school
5 districts relating to student health services. The department, working in cooperation
6 with the Department for Public Health, shall provide, contract for services, or
7 identify resources to improve student health services, including but not limited to
8 the following:

9 (a) Standardized protocols and guidelines for health procedures to be performed
10 by *licensed* health professionals and *unlicensed* school personnel. The
11 protocols and guidelines shall include but not be limited to the following:

- The delegation of nursing functions consistent with administrative
 regulations promulgated by the Kentucky Board of Nursing;
- 14 2. Training of designated <u>unlicensed[nonmedical]</u> school personnel; and

153.Appropriate documentation and recordkeeping including, but not limited16to, notification to school administrators and parents or guardians of the17provision of health services by a school employee, including18certification of medical necessity for health services signed by a health19care professional, and informed consent for the provision of health20services by a parent or guardian.

A copy of the protocols and guidelines shall be made available <u>electronically</u>
to each school in the Commonwealth and shall be <u>on the school district's</u>
<u>Web site[maintained by each school in the school's library];</u>

- (b) Consultation, technical assistance, and development of quality improvement
 measures for the state and local boards of education, individual public
 schools, and local health departments;
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(c) <u>By June 1 of each year, provide training to school district personnel to</u>

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1		<u>facilitate</u> [Facilitation of] statewide and local data collection using the
2		Kentucky Student Information System. Data collected shall include school
3		<u>health service office visits, the disposition of a student after the visit,</u> and <u>the</u>
4		reporting of <u>all</u> school health services <u>provided to students</u> ; and
5		(d) Information, [and] resources, and research based on best practices for [that
6		relate to] the provision of school health services.
7	(2)	The Department of Education shall establish a position to assist in carrying out the
8		responsibilities required under subsection (1) of this section. The position may be
9		established with existing personnel resources, or by contract, with an individual
10		who:
11		(a) Holds, at a minimum, a bachelor's degree in nursing with a master's degree in
12		nursing or a related field from an accredited postsecondary institution; and
13		(b) Is a registered nurse licensed under the provisions of KRS Chapter 314.
14	(3)	The Department of Education shall provide fifty percent (50%) of the costs for the
15		position required by subsection (2) of this section and the Department for Public
16		Health shall provide the remaining fifty percent (50%) for the position. The
17		Department of Education may enter into a contractual arrangement, such as a
18		Memorandum of Agreement, with the Department for Public Health to share the
19		costs.

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
