7	economic, social, and cultural heritage of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the local
8	communities which it serves; and
9	WHEREAS, the beverage industry has grown to include soft drinks, diet soft
10	drinks, bottled water, fruit juices, ready-to-drink teas, sports drinks, and energy drinks,
11	among other variations in order to meet the demands of customers; and
12	WHEREAS, the nonalcoholic beverage industry employs nearly 4,000 people in 34
13	facilities across the Commonwealth; and
14	WHEREAS, the products Kentucky beverage companies produce benefit local
15	businesses and lead to an additional 13,000 jobs in the Commonwealth; and
16	WHEREAS, the nonalcoholic beverage industry has a direct economic impact on
17	the Commonwealth of \$2.6 billion; and
18	WHEREAS, \$438.9 million of taxes are generated at the state and federal level
19	from Kentucky nonalcoholic beverage companies; and
20	WHEREAS, Kentucky beverage companies and their employees generously
21	contribute \$16.1 million to charitable causes across the Commonwealth; and
22	WHEREAS, Kentucky's beverage companies are American companies, making
23	American products, in America's hometowns;
24	NOW, THEREFORE,
25	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
26	Kentucky:
27	→ Section 1. The Senate hereby honors the Kentucky Beverage Association and its
